HOUSE BILL 1041

Short Title: Names of Certain Public Projects.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE NAMING OF A PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT, A
PUBLIC BUILDING, OR A STATE HIGHWAY AFTER A LIVING PERSON.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Article 1 of Chapter 133 of the General Statutes is amended by
adding a new section to read:

"§ 133-1.2. Names of public works.

No city, county, or State work supported wholly or in part with public funds may be
named after a living person. G.S. 133-4 does not apply to this section."

Sec. 2. Article 8 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by
adding a new section to read:

"§ 143-135.6. Names of public buildings.

No building for the State, or for any county or municipality built pursuant to this
Article may be named after a living person."

Sec. 3. G.S. 136-18(8) reads as rewritten:

"(8) To give suitable names to State highways and change the names as
determined by the Board of Transportation of any highways that shall
become a part of the State system of ~~highways~~-highways: Provided,
no State highway may be named after a living person."

Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification.
