1		A BILL TO BE ENTITLED	
2	AN ACT TO MODIFY THE LAWS REGULATING THE OPERATION OF TOUR		
3	BOATS WITH ABC PERMITS.		
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	Section 1. G.S. 18B-1006(i) reads as rewritten:		
6	"(i) Tour Boats The Commission may issue permits to boats that conduct		
7	regularly scheduled tours upon the rivers or waterways of this State under the following		
8	conditions:		
9	(1)	A boat shall serve meals on each tour and shall have a dining area with	
10		seating for at least 36 people;	
11	(2)	A boat's gross receipts from food and non-alcoholic beverages shall be	
12		greater than its gross receipts from alcoholic beverages;	
13	(3)	A boat may hold the permits listed in G.S. 18B-1001(1), (3), (5), and	
14	4.00	(10), but no off-premises sales may be made pursuant to those permits;	
15	(4)	A boat shall dock have a home port in an area where issuance of the	
16		permits listed in subdivision (3) is legal, and all passengers shall enter	
17		and leave the boat at the home port or at other ports listed on a	
18		preannounced itinerary. there. While tour passengers are on board, the boat	
19		may not dock at any other place except for an emergency. The boat's	
20		permits are valid during tours that leave and return to the boat's home	
21		port, and apply regardless of whether the boat crosses into an area	
22		where sales are not legal, if the boat docks only at a port listed on the	
23		preannounced itinerary, except in an emergency. The boat's permits are	

1		valid during these tours, regardless of whether the boat crosses into an ar-
2		where sales are not legal—and
3	(5)	A boat may not serve or sell any alcoholic beverages except during tours.
4	. ,	boat conducting tours along the intracoastal waterway and navigab
5		waterways that enters into the intracoastal waterway, pursuant to
6		preannounced itinerary that includes visits to two or more cities, ma
7		serve alcoholic beverages pursuant to ABC permits issued according
8		the jurisdiction of its home port in the following manner:
9		While on tour, alcoholic beverages may be served
0		passengers;
1		b. While docked in any other port alcoholic beverages may be
2		served only to tour passengers and its crew;
3		During special city-sponsored events and festivals, in which
4		case the boat may open its galley and bars at dockside to the
5		general public and sell those alcoholic beverages that are lawf
6		in the jurisdiction in which it is docked. Any sales in th
7		manner shall be in accordance with the requirements of ar
8		ordinances of the jurisdiction in which the boat is docked.
9	<u>(6)</u>	Liquor purchased for resale in mixed beverages may be purchase
20		only from the local board for the jurisdiction of the boat's home port.
