The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Chapter 62 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

# "§ 62-133.3. Dual party relay service.

- (a) The General Assembly finds and declares that it is in the public interest to provide access to all public telecommunication services to all citizens of this State, particularly to hearing impaired persons, speech impaired persons, or persons who are similarly impaired.
- (b) The North Carolina Utilities Commission shall establish, implement, administer, and promote a statewide dual party telephone relay service, and contract for the administration and operation of such relay service, for the utilization of telecommunication services by hearing impaired persons, speech impaired persons, or persons who are similarly impaired. The Commission may use assistance from public agencies of the State or federal government or from private organizations to accomplish the purposes of this section.
- (c) The Commission shall require local exchange telephone companies in this State, including those operated by telephone membership corporations, to impose a

monthly maintenance surcharge on all residential and business local exchange access 1 2 facilities. For the purpose of this section, exchange access facility means the access 3 from a particular telephone subscriber's premise to the telephone system of a local exchange telephone company. Exchange access facilities include local exchange 4 5 company provided access lines, private branch exchange trunks, and centrex network 6 access registers, all as defined by tariffs of telephone companies as approved by the Commission. The amount of the surcharge shall be determined by the Commission based upon the amount of funding necessary to accomplish the purposes of this section 9 and provide the services on an ongoing basis. The local exchange companies shall 10 collect the surcharge from their customers and transfer the monies collected to a special fund, to be held by the Treasurer as a nonreverting special fund pursuant to G.S. 147-11 12 69.2 and G.S. 147-69.3 and shall be credited with interest and income. The fund shall be used solely for the administration and operation of the relay service. These funds 13 14 may not be used to lease or purchase telecommunications devices for the deaf used by 15 telephone subscribers, except those used by the operator of the relay service. The users of the relay service shall be charged for telephone services (including the surcharge 16 17 authorized in this subsection) without additional charges for the use of the relay 18 service."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
