April 12, 1989 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO REDUCE THE PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO WEAR HELMETS ON 3 MOTORCYCLES, TO MAKE FAILURE TO WEAR HELMETS ON MOPEDS AN INFRACTION, AND TO AMEND THE DRIVING WHILE IMPAIRED 4 STATUTES RELATING TO THE DEFINITION OF VEHICLE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 20-140.4 reads as rewritten: "§ 20-140.4. Special provisions for motorcycles and mopeds. No person shall operate a motorcycle or moped upon a highway or public vehicular area: (1) When the number of persons upon such motorcycle or moped, including the operator, shall exceed the number of persons which it 12 was designed to carry. 14 (2)

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- Unless the operator and all passengers thereon wear safety helmets of a type approved by the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles.
- Violation of any provision of this section shall not be considered negligence per se or contributory negligence per se in any civil action.
- Any person convicted of violating this section shall have committed an infraction and shall be fined according to G.S. 20-135.2A(e) and (f)."
