1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO ADD AN ADDITIONAL MAGISTRATE IN ALAMANCE COUNTY.
3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 Section 1. G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:

5 "§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional
6 seats of court, by counties.

7 Each district court district shall have the numbers of judges and each county within
8 the district shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, as set
9 forth in the following table:

22 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative
 23 Office of the Courts \$21,443 for fiscal year 1989-90 and \$20,687 for fiscal year 1990-
 24 91 for an additional magistrate in Alamance County to implement this act.

25 Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
