1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR AN AGE SEVENTY SPORTSMAN COMBINATION  
3 HUNTING-FISHING LICENSE.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. G.S. 113-270.2(c) reads as rewritten:

6 "(c) The hunting licenses issued by the Wildlife Resources Commission are as  
7 follows:

8 (1) Resident sportsman combination license – \$40.00. This license is valid  
9 only for use by an individual resident of the State.

10 (1a) Lifetime sportsman combination licenses. – These licenses are valid  
11 only for use by individual holders and are of the following types  
12 depending on the holders' ages on the dates of issue:

13 a. Type I available only to an individual under one year of age –  
14 \$200.00.

15 b. Type Y available only to an individual under 12 years of age –  
16 \$350.00.

17 c. Type A available to a resident individual of any age – \$500.00.

18 d. Type N available to a nonresident individual of any age –  
19 \$1,000.

20 (2) Resident combination hunting-fishing license – \$20.00. This license is  
21 valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.

22 (3) Resident State hunting license – \$15.00. This license is valid only for  
23 use by an individual resident of the State.

- 1 (3a) Lifetime resident comprehensive hunting license – \$250.00. This  
2 license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- 3 (4) Resident county hunting license – \$10.00. This license is valid for use  
4 by an individual resident of the State within the county in which he  
5 resides.
- 6 (5) Controlled shooting preserve hunting license – \$15.00. This license is  
7 valid only for use by an individual hunting in special controlled  
8 shooting preserves licensed in accordance with this Subchapter.
- 9 (6) Nonresident sportsman combination license – \$130.00. This license is  
10 valid for use by an individual within the State.
- 11 (7) Repealed by Session Laws 1987, c. 156, s. 1.
- 12 (8) Nonresident six-day hunting license – \$40.00. This license is valid  
13 only for use on six consecutive hunting days by an individual within  
14 the State. Consecutive hunting days do not include Sundays except on  
15 military reservations where Sunday hunting is permitted.
- 16 (8a) Resident comprehensive hunting license – \$30.00. This license is valid  
17 only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- 18 (8b) Nonresident comprehensive hunting license – \$80.00. This license is  
19 valid for use by an individual within the State.
- 20 (9) Disabled veteran lifetime combination hunting-fishing license – \$7.50.  
21 This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State  
22 who is a fifty percent (50%) or more disabled war veteran as  
23 determined by the Veterans Administration. The license is valid for the  
24 life of the individual so long as he remains fifty percent (50%) or more  
25 disabled.
- 26 (10) [Reserved.]
- 27 (11) Age 70 lifetime sportsman combination ~~hunting-fishing~~ license –  
28 \$10.00. This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of  
29 the State who has attained the age of 70 years. The license is valid for  
30 the life of the individual.
- 31 (12) Totally disabled resident combination hunting-fishing license – \$7.50.  
32 This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State  
33 who is totally disabled (physically incapable of being gainfully  
34 employed). This license is valid for the life of the individual so long as  
35 he remains totally disabled."

- 37 "(d) The hook-and-line fishing licenses issued by the Wildlife Resources  
38 Commission are as follows:
- 39 (1) Repealed by Session Laws 1979, c. 830, s. 1.
- 40 (1a) Resident Sportsman Combination License – \$40.00. This license is  
41 valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- 42 (1b) Resident comprehensive fishing licenses valid only for use by  
43 individual residents of the State:
- 44 a. One day – \$10.00.

- 1 b, c. Repealed by Session Laws 1987, c. 156, s. 8.  
2 d. Annual – \$25.00.
- 3 (1c) Lifetime Sportsman Combination Licenses – These licenses are valid  
4 only for use by individual holders and are of the following types  
5 depending on the holders' ages on the dates of issue.
- 6 a. Type I available only to an individual under one year of age –  
7 \$200.00.  
8 b. Type Y available only to an individual under 12 years of age –  
9 \$350.00.  
10 c. Type A available to a resident individual of any age – \$500.00.  
11 d. Type N available to a nonresident individual of any age –  
12 \$1,000.
- 13 (2) Resident Combination Hunting-Fishing License – \$20.00. This license  
14 is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- 15 (2a) Resident State Fishing License – \$15.00. This license is valid only for  
16 use by an individual resident of the State.
- 17 (2b) Lifetime Resident Comprehensive Fishing License – \$250.00. This  
18 license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- 19 (3) Resident County Fishing License – \$10.00. This license is valid only  
20 for use by an individual resident of the State within the county in  
21 which he resides.
- 22 (4) Resident one-day State fishing license valid only for use by an  
23 individual resident of the State during the day indicated: – \$5.00.  
24 a.-c. Repealed by Session Laws 1987, c. 156, s. 8.
- 25 (4a) Nonresident Sportsman Combination License – \$130.00. This license  
26 is valid for use by an individual within the State.
- 27 (4b) Nonresident comprehensive fishing licenses valid for use by an  
28 individual within the State only during the day, consecutive days, or  
29 year indicated:  
30 a. One day – \$15.00.  
31 b. Three days – \$25.00.  
32 c. Repealed by Session Laws 1987, c. 156, s. 8.  
33 d. Annual – \$50.00.
- 34 (5) Nonresident State Fishing License – \$30.00. This license is valid for  
35 use by an individual within the State.
- 36 (6) Nonresident variable short-term State fishing licenses which are valid  
37 only for use by an individual within the State during the day or  
38 consecutive days indicated at the following rates:  
39 a. One day – \$10.00.  
40 b. Three days – \$15.00.  
41 c. Repealed by Session Laws 1987, c. 156, s. 8.
- 42 (7) Lifetime Fishing License for the Legally Blind – No charge. This  
43 license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State who  
44 has been certified by the Department of Human Resources as a person

1                   whose vision with glasses is insufficient for use in ordinary  
2                   occupations for which sight is essential. This license is valid for the  
3                   life of the individual so long as he remains legally blind.

4                   (8)   Disabled Veteran Lifetime Combination Hunting-Fishing License –  
5                   \$7.50. This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the  
6                   State who is a fifty percent (50%) or more disabled war veteran as  
7                   determined by the Veterans Administration. The license is valid for the  
8                   life of the individual so long as he remains fifty percent (50%) or more  
9                   disabled.

10                  (9)   [Reserved.]

11                  (10)   Age 70 Lifetime Sportsman Combination ~~Hunting-Fishing~~ License –  
12                  \$10.00. This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of  
13                  the State who has attained the age of 70 years. The license is valid for  
14                  the life of the individual.

15                  (11)   Totally Disabled Resident Combination Hunting-Fishing License –  
16                  \$7.50. This license is valid only for use of an individual resident of the  
17                  State who is totally disabled (physically incapable of being gainfully  
18                  employed). This license is valid for the life of the individual so long as  
19                  he remains totally disabled."

20                  Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1990.
