1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW REGARDING CERTAIN RETIRED LAW
3 ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' RELATIONSHIP TO THE COMPREHENSIVE
4 MAJOR MEDICAL PLAN.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. G.S. 135-40.2(a) reads as rewritten:

7 "(a) The following persons are eligible for coverage under the Plan, on a
8 noncontributory basis, subject to the provisions of G.S. 135-40.3:

9 (1) All permanent full-time employees of an employing unit who meet the
10 following conditions:

11 a. Paid from general or special State funds, or

12 b. Paid from non-State funds and in a group for which his or her
13 employing unit has agreed to provide coverage.

14 Employees of State agencies, departments, institutions, boards, and
15 commissions not otherwise covered by the Plan who are employed in
16 permanent job positions on a recurring basis and who work 30 or more
17 hours per week for nine or more months per calendar year are covered
18 by the provisions of this subdivision.

19 (1a) Permanent hourly employees as defined in G.S. 126-5(c4) who work at
20 least one-half of the workdays of each pay period.

21 (2) Retired teachers, State employees, ~~and~~ members of the General
22 ~~Assembly~~ Assembly, and retired State law enforcement officers who

2 1985.
- 3 (2a) Surviving spouses of:
- 4 a. Deceased retired employees, provided the death of the former
5 plan member occurred prior to October 1, 1986; and
- 6 b. Deceased teachers, State employees, and members of the
7 General Assembly who are receiving a survivor's alternate
8 benefit under any of the State-supported retirement programs,
9 provided the death of the former plan member occurred prior to
10 October 1, 1986.
- 11 (3) Repealed by Session Laws 1985 (Reg. Sess., 1986), c. 1020, s. 29(b),
12 effective January 1, 1988.
- 13 (3a) Employees of the General Assembly, not otherwise covered by this
14 section, as determined by the Legislative Services Commission, except
15 for legislative interns and pages.
- 16 (4) Members of the General Assembly."
- 17 Sec. 2. This act shall become effective the first day of the calendar month
18 following ratification of this act, and applies to coverage in accordance with the
19 provisions of G.S. 135-40.3.
