- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 37.6(f)(1) reads as rewritten:

- 6 A violation of G.S. 20-37.6(e)(1), (2) or (3) is an infraction which "(1) carries a penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) one hundred dollars 7 (\$100.00) and whenever evidence shall be presented in any court of 8 the fact that any automobile, truck, or other vehicle was found to be 9 parked in a properly designated handicapped parking space in violation 10 of the provisions of this section, it shall be prima facie evidence in 11 any court in the State of North Carolina that the vehicle was parked 12 and left in the space by the person, firm, or corporation in whose name 13 the vehicle is registered and licensed according to the records of the 14 Division of Motor Vehicles. No evidence tendered or presented under 15 this authorization shall be admissible or competent in any respect in 16 any court or tribunal except in cases concerned solely with a violation 17 of this section." 18 19 Sec. 2. G.S. 37.6(f)(2) reads as rewritten:
- 20 "(2) A violation of G.S. 20-37.6(e)(4) is an infraction which carries a
 21 penalty of fifty dollars (\$50.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and
 22 whenever evidence shall be presented in any court of the fact that any
 23 such nonconforming sign or markings are being used it shall be prima
 24 facie evidence in any court in the State of North Carolina that the

1	person, firm, or corporation with ownership of the property where said
2	nonconforming signs or markings are located is responsible for
3	violation of this section. Building inspectors and others responsible for
4	North Carolina State Building Code violations specified in G.S. 143-
5	138(h) where such signs are required by the Handicapped Section of
6	the North Carolina State Building Code, may cause a citation to be
7	issued for this violation and may also initiate any appropriate action or
8	proceeding to correct such violation."
9	Sec. 3. This act shall become effective October 1, 1990.
