A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT NORTH CAROLINA SHALL HAVE THE FIRST

- PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY. 3
- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 163-213.2 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 163-213.2. Primary to be held; date; qualifications and registration of voters.

On the second-first Tuesday in March, 1988, 1992, or on the Tuesday immediately 7 preceding the date on which any other state shall hold a similar election, whichever is 8 earlier, but no earlier than the first Tuesday in January, and every four years thereafter, 9 the voters of this State shall be given an opportunity to express their preference for the 10 person to be the presidential candidate of their political party. 11

12 Any person otherwise qualified who will become qualified by age to vote in the general election held in the same year of the presidential preference primary shall be 13 entitled to register and vote in the presidential preference primary. Such persons may 14 15 register not earlier than 60 days nor later than the 21st day prior to the said primary. In addition, persons who will become qualified by age to register and vote in the general 16 election for which the primary is held, who do not register during the special period may 17 18 register to vote after such period as if they were qualified on the basis of age, but until they are qualified by age to vote, they may vote only in primary elections." 19 Sec. 2. G.S. 163-213.4 reads as rewritten:

21 "§ 163-213.4. Nomination by State Board of Elections.

22 The State Board of Elections shall convene in Raleigh on the first Tuesday in January seventy-fifth day preceding the presidential preference primary election. At the meeting 23 required by this section, the State Board of Elections shall nominate as presidential 24

- primary candidates all candidates affiliated with a political party, recognized pursuant to 1 the provisions of Article 9 of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes, who have become 2 3 eligible to receive payments from the Presidential Primary Matching Payment Account, as provided in section 9033 of the U.S.-Internal Revenue Code of 19541986, as 4 5 amended. Immediately upon completion of these requirements, the Board shall release 6 to the news media all such nominees selected. Provided, however, nothing shall prohibit the partial selection of nominees prior to the meeting required by this section, if all 7 8 provisions herein have been complied with."
- 9 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
