1 A JOINT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH 2 COMMISSION TO STUDY THE NEED FOR COMPREHENSIVE GROUNDWATER LEGISLATION TO ADEQUATELY PROTECT 3 THE 4 GROUNDWATER RESOURCES OF NORTH CAROLINA.

5 Whereas, more than half the citizens of North Carolina are dependent on 6 groundwater as their principal source of drinking water; and

Whereas, groundwater resources across the State are increasingly vulnerable
to contamination from many land use activities and an unprecedented number of leaking
underground storage tanks; and

10 Whereas, the State's fragmented groundwater protection authorities have 11 effectively frustrated efforts to protect these resources and to clean up pollution where 12 incidents of groundwater contamination have occurred; and

13 Whereas, this inability to effectively protect groundwater is leading to 14 increased statewide degradation of the resource;

15 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:

16 Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study the impact of 17 fragmented and ambiguous authorities on the State's ability to effectively protect 18 groundwater resources, and to assess the need for a Comprehensive Groundwater 19 Protection Act which would correct this fragmentation problem. The Commission is 20 further authorized to prepare an interim report of its study, and to make a final 21 recommendation, including recommendations to the 1989 General Assembly, Regular 22 Session 1990.
