A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF WAKE FOREST TO LEVY A ROOM  
OCCUPANCY AND TOURISM DEVELOPMENT TAX.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Occupancy tax. (a) Authorization and scope. The Wake Forest Board of Commissioners may by resolution, after not less than 10 days' public notice and after a public hearing held pursuant thereto, levy a room occupancy tax of no more than three percent (3%) of the gross receipts derived from the rental of any room, lodging, or similar accommodation furnished by a hotel, motel, inn, or similar place within the town that is subject to sales tax imposed by the State under G.S. 105-164.4(3). This tax is in addition to any State or local sales or occupancy tax. This tax does not apply to accommodations furnished by nonprofit charitable, educational, or religious organizations.

(b) Collection. Every operator of a business subject to the tax levied under this act shall, on and after the effective date of the levy of the tax, collect the tax. This tax shall be collected as part of the charge for furnishing a taxable accommodation. The tax shall be stated and charged separately from the sales records, and shall be paid by the purchaser to the operator of the business as trustee for and on account of the town. The tax shall be added to the sales price and shall be passed on to the purchaser instead of being borne by the operator of the business. The town shall design, print, and furnish to all appropriate businesses and persons in the town the necessary forms for filing returns and instructions to ensure the full collection of the tax.

(c) Administration. The town shall administer a tax levied under this act. A tax levied under this act is due and payable to the Wake Forest tax collector in monthly

1 installments on or before the 15th day of the month following the month in which the  
2 tax accrues. Every person, firm, corporation, or association liable for the tax shall, on or  
3 before the 15th day of each month, prepare and render a return on a form prescribed by  
4 the town. The return shall state the total gross receipts derived in the preceding month  
5 from rentals upon which the tax is levied. A return filed with the tax collector under  
6 this act is not a public record as defined by G.S. 132-1 and may not be disclosed except  
7 as required by law.

8         The tax collector may collect any unpaid taxes levied under this act through  
9 the use of attachment and garnishment proceedings as provided in G.S. 105-368 for  
10 collection of property taxes. The tax collector has the same enforcement powers  
11 concerning the tax imposed by this act as does the Secretary of Revenue in enforcing  
12 the State sales tax under G.S. 105-164.30.

13         (d) Penalties. A person, firm, corporation, or association who fails or refuses to  
14 file the return required by this act shall pay a penalty of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each  
15 day's omission. In case of failure or refusal to file the return or pay the tax for a period  
16 of 30 days after the time required for filing the return or for paying the tax, there shall  
17 be an additional tax, as a penalty, of five percent (5%) of the tax due in addition to any  
18 other penalty, with an additional tax of five percent (5%) for each additional month or  
19 fraction thereof until the tax is paid.

20         Any person who willfully attempts in any manner to evade a tax imposed  
21 under this act or who willfully fails to pay the tax or make and file a return shall, in  
22 addition to all other penalties provided by law, be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be  
23 punishable by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000), imprisonment not to  
24 exceed six months, or both. The board of commissioners may, for good cause shown,  
25 compromise or forgive the penalties imposed by this subsection.

26         (e) Distribution and use of tax revenue. The tax collector shall remit the  
27 proceeds of this tax to the town on a monthly basis. The town shall use the proceeds  
28 only to promote tourism and economic development in Wake Forest.

29         (f) Effective date of levy. A tax levied under this act shall become effective  
30 on the date specified in the resolution levying the tax. That date must be the first day of  
31 a calendar month, however, and may not be earlier than the first day of the second  
32 month after the date the resolution is adopted.

33         (g) Repeal. A tax levied under this act may be repealed by a resolution  
34 adopted by the Wake Forest Board of Commissioners. Repeal of a tax levied under this  
35 act shall become effective on the first day of a month and may not become effective  
36 until the end of the fiscal year in which the repeal resolution was adopted. Repeal of a  
37 tax levied under this act does not affect a liability for a tax that was attached before the  
38 effective date of the repeal, nor does it affect a right to a refund of a tax that accrued  
39 before the effective date of the repeal.

40         Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
