1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO REVISE AND CONSOLIDATE THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF BRIDGETON AND TO REPEAL PRIOR LOCAL ACTS. 3 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. The Charter of the Town of Bridgeton hereby is revised and 5 6 consolidated to read as follows: 7 "THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF BRIDGETON. **"ARTICLE 1. INCORPORATION, CORPORATE POWERS AND** 8 9 **BOUNDARIES.** 10 "Sec. 1.1. Incorporation. - The Town of Bridgeton, North Carolina in Craven County, and the inhabitants thereof, shall continue to be a municipal body politic and 11

11 County, and the inhabitants thereof, shall continue to be a municipal body politic and 12 corporate, under the name and style of the 'Town of Bridgeton', hereinafter at times 13 referred to as the 'Town'.

"Sec. 1.2. **Powers.** - The Town of Bridgeton shall have and may exercise all of the powers, duties, rights, privileges and immunities, which are now, or hereafter may be conferred, either expressly or by implication, upon the Town of Bridgeton specifically, or upon municipal corporations generally, by this Charter, by the State Constitution, or by general or local law.

19 "Sec. 1.3. Corporate Limits. - The corporate limits of the Town of Bridgeton shall 20 be those existing at the time of ratification of this Charter, as the same are set forth on 21 the official map of the Town, and as the same may be altered from time to time in 22 accordance with law. An official map of the Town, showing the current Town 23 boundaries, shall be maintained permanently in the office of the Town Clerk, and shall

be available for public inspection. Appropriate changes to the official map of the Town 1 2 shall be made after any alterations of the corporate limits made pursuant to law. 3 "ARTICLE 2. MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS. 4 "Sec. 2.1. Governing Body. - The Mayor and Board of Commissioners, elected and constituted as herein set forth, shall be the governing body of the Town. On behalf of 5 the Town, and in conformity with applicable laws, the Mayor and Board may provide 6 7 for the exercise of all municipal powers, and shall be charged with the general 8 government of the Town. 9 "Sec. 2.2. Board of Commissioners; Composition; Terms of Office. - The Board 10 of Commissioners shall be composed of four members, each of whom shall be elected for terms of two years in the manner provided by Article 3 of this Charter, to serve until 11 12 their successors are elected and qualified. 13 "Sec. 2.3. Election of the Mayor; Term of Office; Duties. - The Mayor shall be 14 elected directly by the voters of the Town in the manner provided by Article 3 of this 15 Charter for a term of two years; provided, the Mayor shall serve until his successor is 16 elected and qualified. The Mayor shall be the official head of the Town government 17 and shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Commissioners. He shall have the right 18 to vote only if there are an equal number of votes in the affirmative and the negative on 19 any matter before the Board. The Mayor shall exercise such powers and perform such 20 duties as presently are or hereafter may be conferred upon him by the General Statutes, 21 by this Charter, and by the ordinances of the Town. "Sec. 2.4. Mayor Pro Tempore. - In accordance with applicable State laws, the 22

"Sec. 2.4. Mayor Pro Tempore. - In accordance with applicable State laws, the
 Board of Commissioners shall appoint one of its members to act as Mayor pro tempore
 to perform the duties of the Mayor in the Mayor's absence or disability. The Mayor pro
 tempore as such shall have no fixed term of office, but shall serve in such capacity at the
 pleasure of the remaining members of the Board.

"Sec. 2.5. Meetings of the Board. - In accordance with the General Statutes of
North Carolina, the Board of Commissioners shall establish a suitable time and place for
its regular meetings. Special meetings may be held according to the applicable
provisions of the General Statutes.

31 "Sec. 2.6. Ordinances and Resolutions. - The adoption, amendment, repeal, 32 pleading, or proving of Town ordinances and resolutions shall be in accordance with the 33 applicable provisions of the general laws of North Carolina not inconsistent with this 34 Charter.

35 "Sec. 2.7. Voting and Quorum Requirements. - Official action of the Board of 36 Commissioners shall in every instance be by majority vote, provided that a quorum, 37 consisting of a majority of the actual membership of the Board is present. Vacant seats 38 are to be subtracted from the normal Board membership to determine the actual 39 membership.

"Sec. 2.8. Qualifications for Office; Vacancies; Compensation. - The
compensation of Board members, the filling of vacancies on the Board, and the
qualifications of Board members shall be in accordance with applicable provisions of
the General Statutes.

"ARTICLE 3. ELECTIONS.

"Sec. 3.1. Regular Municipal Elections; Conduct and Method of Election. -1 2 Regular municipal elections shall be held in the Town every two years in odd-numbered years and shall be conducted in accordance with the uniform municipal election laws of 3 North Carolina. The Mayor and members of the Board of Commissioners shall be 4 elected according to the nonpartisan plurality method of elections. Municipal elections 5 6 shall be conducted by the County Board of Elections. 7 "Sec. 3.2. Election of the Board of Commissioners. - At the regular municipal 8 elections in 1989 and biennially thereafter, there shall be elected a Mayor and four 9 commissioners to fill the seats of those officers whose terms are then expiring. 10 "ARTICLE 4. ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION. "Sec. 4.1. Form of Government. - The Town shall operate under the Mayor-11 12 Council form of government, in accordance with the applicable provisions of the 13 General Statutes. 14 "Sec. 4.2. Town Attorney. - The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a Town 15 Attorney to serve at its pleasure and to be its legal adviser. 16 "Sec. 4.3. Town Clerk. - The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a Town Clerk 17 to keep a journal of the proceedings of the Board, to maintain in a safe place all records 18 and documents pertaining to the affairs of the Town, and to perform such other duties as 19 may be required by law or as the Board of Commissioners may direct. 20 "Sec. 4.4. Town Finance Officer. - The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a 21 Town Finance Officer to perform the duties of the finance officer as required by the 22 Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act. 23 "Sec. 4.5. Town Budget Officer. - The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a 24 Town Budget Officer to perform the duties of the budget officer as required by the 25 Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act. "Sec. 4.6. Town Tax Collector. - The Board of Commissioners shall appoint a 26 27 Town Tax Collector to collect all taxes, licenses, fees and other moneys belonging to 28 the Town, subject to the General Statutes, the provisions of this Charter and the 29 ordinances of the Town. The Town Tax Collector shall diligently comply with and 30 enforce all the laws of North Carolina relating to the collection of taxes by 31 municipalities. 32 Consolidation of Functions. - The Board of Commissioners may "Sec. 4.7. consolidate any two or more positions as Town Clerk, Town Tax Collector, Town 33 34 Budget Officer and Town Finance Officer, or may assign the functions of any one or 35 more of these positions to the holder or holders of any other of these positions, subject to the Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act. 36 37 "Sec. 4.8. Other Administrative Officers and Employees. - Consistent with 38 applicable State laws, the Board of Commissioners may establish other positions, 39 provide for the appointment of other administrative officers and employees, and 40 generally organize the Town government in order to promote the orderly and efficient 41 administration of the affairs of the Town." 42 Sec. 2. The purpose of this act is to revise the Charter of the Town of Bridgeton and to consolidate herein certain acts concerning the property, affairs, and 43

Sec. 9. Whenever a reference is made in this act to a particular provision of
 the General Statutes, and such provision is later amended, repealed or superseded, the
 reference shall be deemed amended or refer to the amended General Statute, or to the
 General Statute which most clearly corresponds to the statutory provision which is
 repealed or superseded.
 Sec. 10. All laws and clauses of laws in conflict with the provisions of this
 act are hereby repealed.
