## CHAPTER 336 HOUSE BILL 863

AN ACT CONCERNING STAGGERED TERMS FOR THE TOWN OF LAUREL PARK.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Section 2 of Chapter 622, Session Laws of 1947, as rewritten by Chapter 348, Session Laws of 1987 reads as rewritten:

"Sec. 2. In 1987, and quadrennially thereafter, a Mayor shall be elected for a four-year term. In 1987, three commissioners shall be elected. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes for commissioner shall be elected for a four-year term, and the two candidates receiving the next highest numbers of votes shall be elected for two-year terms. In 1989 and quadrennially thereafter, one commissioner two commissioners shall be elected for a four year term four-year terms. In 1989 one commissioner shall be elected for a two-year term. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes for commissioner in 1989 shall be elected for the four year term, and the candidate receiving the next highest number of votes shall be elected for the two-year term. In 1991 and quadrennially thereafter, two-commissioners—one commissioner shall be elected for four-year terms a four-year term."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.

In the General Assembly read three times and ratified this the 15th day of June, 1989.
