5	Section 1. G.S. 14-159.13 reads as rewritten:				
6	"§ 14-159.13. Second degree trespass.				
7	(a) Offense. – A person commits the offense of second degree trespass if, without				
8	written authorization, he enters or remains on premises of another: another				
9	(1) After he has been notified not to enter or remain there by the owner, by				
10	a person in charge of the premises, by a lawful occupant, or by another				
11	authorized person; or				
12	(2) That that are posted, in a manner reasonably likely to come to the				
13	attention of intruders, with notice not to enter the premises.				
14	(b) Classification. – Second degree trespass is a misdemeanor punishable by				
15	imprisonment for up to 30 days, a fine up to two hundred dollars (\$200.00), of one				
16	thousand dollars (\$1,000) or both."
