 5 Section 1. Article 5 of Chapter 118 of
 - Section 1. Article 5 of Chapter 118 of the General Statutes reads as rewritten:

"ARTICLE 5.

"VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT AND RESCUE <u>RESCUE/EMS</u> SQUAD FUNDS.

9 "§ 118-50. Rural-Volunteer Fire Department Fund.

There is created the Volunteer Fire Department Fund to provide matching 10 (a) grants to volunteer fire departments to purchase equipment and make capital 11 improvements. The Fund shall be set up in the Department of Insurance. The State 12 Treasurer shall invest its assets according to law, and the earnings shall remain in the 13 The Fund shall be distributed under the direction of the Commissioner of 14 Fund. 15 Insurance. Beginning January 1, 1988, an eligible fire department may apply to the Commissioner of Insurance for a grant under this section. Beginning May 1, 1988, and 16 on each May 15, thereafter, the Commissioner shall make grants to eligible fire 17 18 departments subject to the following limitations:

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- (1) The size of a grant may not exceed twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000);
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- (2) The applicant shall match the grant on a dollar-for-dollar basis;

- (3) The grant may be used only for equipment purchases or capital

expenditures necessary to provide fire protection services; and

- (4) An applicant may receive no more than one grant per fiscal year.

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1	In awarding grants under this section, the Commissioner shall to the extent possible		
2	select applicants from all parts of the State based upon need. Up to two percent (2%) of		
3	the Fund may be used for additional staff and resources to administer the Fund in each		
4	fiscal year.		
5	No fire department may be declared ineligible for a grant under this section solely		
6	because it is classified as a municipal fire department.		
7	(b) A fire department is eligible for a grant under this section if:		
8	(1) It serves a response area of 6,000 or less in population;		
9	(2) It is all volunteer; and		
10	(3) It has been certified by the Department of Insurance.		
11	In making the population determination under subdivision (1), the Department shall use		
12	the latest decennial U.S. Census population data.		
13	(c) The Commissioner of Insurance shall submit a written report to the General		
14	Assembly within 60 days after the grants have been made. This report shall contain the		
15	amount of the grant and the name of the recipient.		
16	"§ 118-51. Volunteer Rescue <u>Rescue/EMS</u> Squad Fund.		
17	(a) There is created in the Department of Insurance the Volunteer Rescue		
18	<u>Rescue/EMS</u> Squad Fund to provide matching grants to volunteer rescue squads and		
19	volunteer emergency medical services (EMS) squads to purchase equipment and make		
20	capital improvements. An eligible rescue or EMS squad may apply to the Department		
21	of Insurance for a grant under this section. The application form and criteria for grants		
22	shall be established by the Department and the Office of Emergency Medical Services		
23	in the Department of Human Resources. The State Treasurer shall invest the Fund's		
24	assets according to law, and the earnings shall remain in the Fund. Beginning		
25	December 15, 1989, and on each December 15 thereafter, the Department shall make		
26	grants to eligible rescue and EMS squads subject to the following limitations:		
20	(1) The size of a grant may not exceed fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000);		
28	(1) The applicant shall match the grant on a dollar-for-dollar basis with		
29	non-State funds;		
30	(3) The grant may be used only for equipment purchases or capital

32	(4) An applicant may receive no more than one grant per fiscal year.

8		subsection, seventy-five cents $(75c)$ of the fee for the valid inspection	
9		sticker collected pursuant to subsection (a) shall be transferred to the

19		and eighty-five cents (\$1.85) to the Highway Fund.	
20	(3)	Five cents (5ϕ) of the fee for the valid inspection sticker collected	
21		pursuant to subsections (a) and (a1) shall be transferred each quarter of	
22		the year to the North Carolina Commissioner of Insurance, for the	
23		purpose of funding the Rescue Squad Workers' Relief Fund under	
24		Article 5 of General Statute Chapter 118."
