A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AMEND THE REQUIREMENTS FOR CITIES ELIGIBLE TO DESIGNATE HISTORIC DISTRICTS AS MUNICIPAL SERVICE DISTRICTS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Section 4 of Chapter 621 of the 1987 Session Laws reads as rewritten:

"Sec. 4. This act shall apply only to those cities having a population in excess of 150,000 which are located in counties having two or more cities each of which has a population in excess of 60,000. This act shall also apply to those cities where, at the time of creation of the district, the city had a population of not less than 20,000 nor more than 25,000, was not a county seat, and was located in two counties one of which had eight incorporated municipalities. This act shall also apply to those cities where, at the time of creation of the district, the city is located in a county with a population of more than 100,000, which county has an area of less than 250 square miles. This act shall also apply to all county seats whose population is greater than 200,000 but less than 300,000."

Sec. 2. If this law or application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or application of the law which can be given separate effect and to this end the provisions of this law are declared to be severable.

Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
