SENATE BILL 471

Short Title: Third District Fox Hunting.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE HUNTING FOXES WITH DOGS ON LICENSED
CONTROLLED HUNTING PRESERVES IN CARTERET, CRAVEN, AND
PAMLICO COUNTIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 113-270.2(c) reads as rewritten:

"(c) The hunting licenses issued by the Wildlife Resources Commission are as follows:

- (1) Resident sportsman combination license – \$40.00. This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- (1a) Lifetime sportsman combination licenses. – These licenses are valid only for use by individual holders and are of the following types depending on the holders' ages on the dates of issue:
 - a. Type I available only to an individual under one year of age – \$200.00.
 - b. Type Y available only to an individual under 12 years of age – \$350.00.
 - c. Type A available to a resident individual of any age – \$500.00.
 - d. Type N available to a nonresident individual of any age – \$1,000.
- (2) Resident combination hunting-fishing license – \$20.00. This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- (3) Resident State hunting license – \$15.00. This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.

- 1 (3a) Lifetime resident comprehensive hunting license – \$250.00. This
2 license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- 3 (4) Resident county hunting license – \$10.00. This license is valid for use
4 by an individual resident of the State within the county in which he
5 resides.
- 6 (5) ~~Controlled shooting-hunting~~ preserve hunting license – \$15.00. This
7 license is valid only for use by an individual hunting ~~in special~~
8 ~~controlled shooting preserves within a controlled hunting preserve~~
9 licensed in accordance with this Subchapter.
- 10 (6) Nonresident sportsman combination license – \$130.00. This license is
11 valid for use by an individual within the State.
- 12 (7) Repealed by Session Laws 1987, c. 156, s. 1.
- 13 (8) Nonresident six-day hunting license – \$40.00. This license is valid
14 only for use on six consecutive hunting days by an individual within
15 the State. Consecutive hunting days do not include Sundays except on
16 military reservations where Sunday hunting is permitted.
- 17 (8a) Resident comprehensive hunting license – \$30.00. This license is valid
18 only for use by an individual resident of the State.
- 19 (8b) Nonresident comprehensive hunting license – \$80.00. This license is
20 valid for use by an individual within the State.
- 21 (9) Disabled veteran lifetime combination hunting-fishing license – \$7.50.
22 This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State
23 who is a fifty percent (50%) or more disabled war veteran as
24 determined by the Veterans Administration. The license is valid for the
25 life of the individual so long as he remains fifty percent (50%) or more
26 disabled.
- 27 (10) [Reserved.]
- 28 (11) Age 70 lifetime combination hunting-fishing license – \$10.00. This
29 license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State who
30 has attained the age of 70 years. The license is valid for the life of the
31 individual.
- 32 (12) Totally disabled resident combination hunting-fishing license – \$7.50.
33 This license is valid only for use by an individual resident of the State
34 who is totally disabled (physically incapable of being gainfully
35 employed). This license is valid for the life of the individual so long as
36 he remains totally disabled."

37 Sec. 2. G.S. 113-273(g) reads as rewritten:

38 "(g) ~~Controlled Shooting-Hunting~~ Preserve Operator License. – The Wildlife
39 Resources Commission is authorized by rule to set standards for and to license the
40 operation of controlled ~~shooting-hunting~~ preserves operated by private persons. A
41 ~~"controlled shooting preserve" is an area on which only domestically raised game birds other~~
42 ~~than wild turkeys are taken.~~ Controlled hunting preserves are of two types: one is an area
43 marked with appropriate signs along the outside boundaries on which only domestically
44 raised game birds other than wild turkeys are taken; the other is an area of not less than

1 100 acres enclosed with a dog-proof fence on which foxes may be hunted with dogs
2 only. Operators of controlled fox hunting preserves may purchase live foxes from
3 licensed trappers who live-trap foxes during any open season for trapping them. The
4 controlled hunting preserve operator license ~~This license~~ may be purchased for a fee of
5 fifty dollars (\$50.00), and is an annual license issued beginning August 1 each year
6 running until the following July 1."

7 Sec. 3. This act shall apply only to Carteret, Craven, and Pamlico Counties.

8 Sec. 4. Section 2 of this act shall become effective October 1, 1989; the
9 remainder of this act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
