2 AN ACT TO ALLOW RENTAL FOR DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION 3 EMPLOYEES OF UNIFORMS THAT INCLUDE DAY-GLO ORANGE SHIRTS

- TO BE PAID THROUGH PAYROLL DEDUCTION.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
 - Section 1. G.S. 143-3.3(a) reads as rewritten:

All transfers and assignments made of any claim upon the State of North 7 "(a) Carolina or any of its departments, bureaus or commissions or upon any State institution 8 or of any part or share thereof or interest therein, whether absolute or conditional and 9 whatever may be the consideration therefor and all powers of attorney, orders or other 10 authorities for receiving payment of any such claim or any part or share thereof shall be 11 12 absolutely null and void unless such claim has been duly audited and allowed and the amount due thereon fixed and a warrant for the payment thereof has been issued; and no 13 warrant shall be issued to any assignee of any claim or any part or share thereof or 14 interest therein: Provided that this section shall not apply to assignments made in favor 15 of hospitals, building and loan associations, prepaid legal services, uniform rental firms 16 to allow employees of the Department of Transportation to rent uniforms that include 17 day-glo orange shirts or vests as required by federal and State law, and medical, 18 hospital, disability and life insurance companies: Provided further, that any employee of 19 the State or of any of its institutions, departments, bureaus, agencies or commissions, 20 21 who is a member of any credit union organized pursuant to Chapter 54 of the North 22 Carolina General Statutes having a membership at least one half of whom are employed by the State or its institutions, departments, bureaus, agencies or commissions, may 23 authorize, in writing, the periodic deduction from his salary of wages as such employee 24

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of a designated lump sum, which shall be paid to such credit unions when said salaries 1 2 or wages are payable, for deposit to such accounts, purchase of such shares or payment 3 of such obligations as the employee and the credit union may agree: Provided further, that any employee of the State or of any of its institutions, departments, bureaus, 4 5 agencies or commissions, or any of its community colleges, who is a member of a 6 domiciled State employees' association with a membership of not less than 5,000 7 members, the majority of whom are State employees, may authorize in writing the 8 periodic deduction from his salary or wages a designated sum to be paid to the 9 employees' association. This plan of payroll deductions for State employees and other 10 association members shall become null and void at such time as the employee association engages in collective bargaining. Except as otherwise provided, nothing in 11 this last proviso shall apply to local boards of education, county or municipal 12 13 governments or any local governmental units. Provided further, that subject to the rules 14 and regulations adopted by the State Controller, any employee of the State or of any of 15 its institutions, departments, bureaus, agencies or commissions may authorize in writing 16 the withholding from his salary or wages an amount to satisfy his pledge to the State 17 Employees Combined Campaign. Provided further, that subject to any rules and 18 regulations adopted by the State Controller, any employee of a local board of education 19 or community college may authorize in writing the withholding from his salary or 20 wages a periodic deduction of a designated sum to be paid to any organization which 21 qualifies for recognition of exemption by the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable 22 organization as defined in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code which has 23 first been approved by his local board of education or community college board."

24 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
