The representative of the Department of Public Instruction shall be appointed by the Secretary of the Department and shall serve on the Commission until a 19 20 successor is appointed. 21 (b)The terms of the members first appointed shall commence July 1, 19771989. At the expiration of the term of any member of the CouncilCommission, his successor 22 23 shall be appointed for a term of four years except for the members of the House and the 24 Senate who shall serve terms of two years. 25 Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of term in the membership of the Council Commission shall be filled by the Governor, the Speaker of the House, the 26 27 Lieutenant Governor or the appropriate appointing authority. No person shall be eligible to 28 serve more than two successive terms other than the representatives of the above named State 29 agencies.
