Technical Considerations/Comments

House Bill 8 simply enlarges the pool of applicants for grants awarded each December 15 from the Volunteer Rescue Squad Fund. It is anticipated that \$1 million will be generated annually for this Fund from a 20¢ levy on vehicle safety inspection stickers. The Fund's first quarter collections, for the period ending December 30, 1988, was \$229,144. The Fund retains all interest earned.

Grant applications will be available to rescue units in June 1989. The Department of Insurance, Fire and Rescue Division is currently surveying county managers to determine the number of eligible units.
