## Description of Legislation

## 1. Summary of Legislation

- H 53. TEACHER OF YEAR ON STATE BOARD. "TO PROVIDE FOR THE NORTH CAROLINA TEACHER OF THE YEAR TO SERVE AS AN ADVISORY MEMBER TO THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION." Amends GS 115C-11 to provide that each State Teacher of the Year, as designated by the Department of Public Instruction, serves ex officio as advisor to the State Board of Education (SBE) for two years, starting at beginning of term as Teacher of the Year. Permits SBE to exclude teacher from executive sessions. Provides that if vacancy occurs in this advisory position, teacher who was runner-up to Teacher of the Year fills unexpired term. Begins with Teacher of the Year for 1989-90.
