Technical Considerations/Comments

The Department of Human Resources, Division of Social Services advises that given the complexity of system development, no sum of money will enable the Department to establish such a system by October 1, 1989. The Department is also concerned that applying system development efforts to this bill will jeopardize the department's effort to meet the requirements of the federal Family Support Act of 1988.

Beginning May 28, 1989, non-AFDC child support payments with no arrears in the Aid to Families With Dependent Children program are being distributed to custodial parents on a weekly turnaround basis. In addition, the Division is working on systems development to meet federally mandated time lines for payment distribution on all cases. Regulations governing time lines for performance will be published in August 1989.
