2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR MENTAL HEALTH STUDY
3 COMMISSION AND COALITION 2001 PLANS FOR MENTAL HEALTH,
4 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES IN
5 NORTH CAROLINA.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
8 Human Resources, Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and
9 Substance Abuse Services, the sum of thirty-two million nine hundred thousand five
10 hundred thirty-seven dollars (\$32,900,537) for the 1992-93 fiscal year. These funds
11 shall be allocated as follows to implement the Mental Health Study Commission and
12 Coalition 2001 plans for mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse
13 services in North Carolina:

14 (1) Services for the Mentally Ill:

- 15 a. A project administered by the Mental Health Association in
16 North Carolina for the starting up and operation of the 1991
17 HUD Fund Reservations for apartments for persons with severe
18 and persistent mental illness - four hundred forty-eight thousand
19 seven hundred fifty dollars (\$448,750);
20 b. Services to overcome current communications barriers that
21 prevent deaf persons from receiving adequate mental health

- 1 services - four hundred eighty-two thousand seven hundred
2 eighty-seven dollars (\$482,787);
- 3 c. Implementation of the statewide adult mental health plan to
4 provide services to more than 84,000 mentally ill individuals -
5 five million dollars (\$5,000,000);
- 6 d. Implementation of the statewide child mental health plan to
7 provide services to more than 40,000 seriously, emotionally
8 disturbed children - five million dollars (\$5,000,000);
- 9 (2) Developmental Disabilities Services:
- 10 a. Wage and hour adjustment for DDA Group Homes - two
11 million four hundred thirty-two thousand dollars (\$2,432,000);
- 12 b. Increased appropriations for ADAP slots - two million dollars
13 (\$2,000,000);
- 14 c. Capital and start-up funds for United Cerebral Palsy
15 developmental centers - five hundred thousand dollars
16 (\$500,000);
- 17 d. Start-up and operation funds for HUD homes sponsored by
18 ARC/Autism and others - one million seven hundred fifty-four
19 thousand dollars (\$1,754,000);
- 20 e. P.L. 99-457 Transportation funds to meet a federal mandate -
21 five hundred sixteen thousand dollars (\$516,000);
- 22 f. The starting up and operating of programs for low-incidence
23 populations - eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000);
- 24 g. Core services for area programs to implement Mental Health
25 Study Commission Plans - two million eight hundred ninety
26 thousand dollars (\$2,890,000);
- 27 h. Coordination of assistive technology services - seventy-seven
28 thousand dollars (\$77,000);
- 29 (3) Substance Abuse Services:
- 30 a. Core community-based services as set out in the State Plan for
31 Adult Substance Abuse Services, with highest priorities to
32 intensive outpatient and case management services - five
33 million five hundred thousand dollars (\$5,500,000);
- 34 b. Women's treatment services - one million eight hundred
35 thousand dollars (\$1,800,000);
- 36 c. Implementation of the State Plan for Youth Substance Abuse
37 Services - one million five hundred thousand dollars
38 (\$1,500,000);
- 39 d. Access to treatment - two million dollars (\$2,000,000);
- 40 e. Implementation of the Oxford house model - two hundred
41 thousand dollars (\$200,000).
