2	AN ACT TO ALLOW CITIES AND COUNTIES TO USE PROPERTY TAXES TO
3	SUPPORT PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION WITHOUT CALLING A
4	REFERENDUM.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 153A-149(c) reads as rewritten:
7	"(c) Each county may levy property taxes for one or more of the purposes listed in
8	this subsection up to a combined rate of one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) on the one
9	hundred dollars (\$100.00) appraised value of property subject to taxation. Authorized
10	purposes subject to the rate limitation are:
11	(1) To provide for the general administration of the county through the
12	board of county commissioners, the office of the county manager,
13	the office of the county budget officer, the office of the county
14	finance officer, the office of the county assessor, the office of the
15	county tax collector, the county purchasing agent, and the county
16	attorney, and for all other general administrative costs not allocated
17	to a particular board, commission, office, agency, or activity of the
18	county.
