5	Section 1. Chapter 19A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new		
6	Article to read:

12	<u>(1)</u>	'Animal Shelter' means a facility that is used to house animals and is	
13		owned and operated by a political subdivision of the State or by an	
14		organization devoted to the welfare, protection, and humane treatment	
15		<u>of animals.</u>	
16	<u>(2)</u>	<u>'Cat' means a domestic cat (Felis domestica).</u>	
17	<u>(3)</u>	<u>'Dog' means a domestic dog (Canis familiaris).</u>	
18	<u>(4)</u>	'Sterilized' means spayed, with respect to female cats and dogs, and	
19		neutered, with respect to male cats and dogs.

2		adopts the cat or dog that provides that the purchaser or adopter shall	
3		take the cat or dog to a licensed veterinarian within a stipulated period	
4		of time, not to exceed seven days after the sale or adoption, to have the	
5		cat or dog examined and to schedule a specific time for the	
6		sterilization of the cat or dog. The animal shelter shall require from	
7		the purchaser or adopter a sterilization deposit sufficient to ensure that	
8		he obtains the sterilization. Upon certification by a licensed	
9		veterinarian that the sterilization has been performed, the sterilization	
10		deposit shall be paid to the veterinarian who performed the	
11		sterilization if he has not been compensated for his services. If the	
12		veterinarian has been partially compensated, the animal shelter shall	
13		pay the veterinarian to the extent that he has not been compensated. If	
14		the sterilization deposit or any part of it is not payable to a veterinarian	
15		following the sterilization, the purchaser or adopter is entitled to a	
16		refund of any unexpended amount.
