21	(a) There is hereby created the North Carolina Air Cargo Airport Authority
22	which shall be a body corporate and politic having the powers and jurisdiction
23	hereinafter enumerated, and such other and additional powers as may from time to time
25	be conferred upon the Authority by further acts of the General Assembly. The
26	Authority shall be a public agency and an instrumentality of the State for the
27	performance of essential governmental and public functions.
28	(b) The Board of Directors of the Authority shall be its governing board, which
29	shall consist of not less than 10 members. Three members shall be appointed by the
30	Governor; two members shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the
31	recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives in accordance with
32	G.S.120-121; two members shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the
33	recommendation of the President of the Senate in accordance with G.S.120-121; and
34	two members shall be appointed by the General Assembly upon the recommendation of
35	the President Pro Tempore of the Senate in accordance with G.S.120-121; the State
36	Treasurer shall serve as a member by virtue of his office; and within 90 days after the
37	acquisition of land by the Authority for development as part of a cargo airport site,
38	either by purchase or condemnation, the board of county commissioners in any county
39	in which a portion of such land is located may, by a majority vote of those
40	commissioners in attendance, appoint one member to serve on the Authority.
41	(c) <u>Appointments made shall be for the terms set forth by the following:</u>
42	(1) Appointments made by the Governor shall be for a term of four years, initially anding on December 21, 1005; and
43	initially ending on December 31, 1995; and

1	(2) Appointments made by the General Assembly upon the
2	recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the
3	President of the Senate, or the President Pro Tempore of the Senate
4	shall be made in accordance with G.S. 120-121 for a term of four
5	years, initially ending on December 31, 1995; and
6	(3) Appointments made by the boards of county commissioners shall be
7	for a term of four years, initially ending on the second December 31
8	occurring after such appointment.
9	The members of the Authority appointed by the governor shall be selected from the
10	State-at-large and insofar as practicable shall represent the geographical regions of the
11	State and shall be representative of business, agribusiness, and industrial interests of the
12	State. The Governor shall convene the first meeting, at which time the members of the
13	Authority shall elect from their membership a chairman and vice-chairman of the
14	Authority.
15	(d) <u>All members of the Board shall remain in office until their successors are</u>
16	appointed and qualify. Vacancies in appointments made by the Governor or a board of
17	county commissioners shall be filled by the Governor or the county commissioners for
18	the remainder of the unexpired terms. Vacancies in appointments made by the General
19	Assembly upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
20	the President of the Senate, or the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall be filled in
21	accordance with G.S. 120-122. Persons appointed to fill vacancies shall qualify in the
22	same manner as persons appointed for full terms.
23	(e) Any member of the Board may be removed from office for misfeasance,
24	malfeasance, nonfeasance, or improper influence in accordance with the provisions of
25	G.S. 143B-13, and the resulting vacancy shall be filled as provided herein for vacancies
26	in general.
27	(f) The Board shall adopt bylaws with respect to the calling of meetings,
28	quorums, voting procedures, the keeping of records and such other organizational and
29	administrative matters as the Board may determine. A quorum shall consist of no less
30	than five members of the Board.
31	(g) <u>No vacancy in the membership of the Board shall impair the right of a</u>
32	quorum to exercise all rights and to perform all the duties of the Board and the
33	Authority.
34	(h) No part of the revenues or assets of the Authority shall inure to the benefit of
35	or be distributable to its members or officers or other private persons. The members of
36	the Board shall receive no salary for their services but shall be entitled to receive per
37	diem and allowances in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5.
38	" <u>§ 159J-5. Powers of the Authority.</u>
39	(a) <u>The Authority shall have all of the powers necessary or convenient to carry</u>
40	out and to effect the purposes and provisions of this Chapter for promoting, developing,
41	constructing, equipping, maintaining and operating cargo airports, cargo handling
42	systems, infrastructure necessary to support human traffic, industrial and commercial
43	property within cargo airport complexes, and works of internal improvements incident therate, including the acquisition or construction maintenance and operation at such
44	thereto, including the acquisition or construction, maintenance and operation at such

1	complexes of l	highways and bridges thereon or essential for the proper operation
2		ng, without limitation, the powers:
3	<u>(1)</u>	To sue and be sued, to make contracts, and to adopt and use a common
4		seal, and to alter the same as may be deemed expedient;
5	<u>(2)</u>	To purchase, acquire, establish, finance, construct, own, control, lease,
6		sell, equip, improve, maintain, operate, and regulate cargo airport
7		complexes and for any of such purposes, to own, hold, finance, lease,
8		sell, and/or operate real or personal property;
9	<u>(3)</u>	To charge and collect fees and rents for the use of the cargo airport
10		complexes or for services rendered in the operation thereof;
11	<u>(4)</u>	To make all necessary contracts and arrangements with other
12		authorities of North Carolina and other states for the interchange of
13		business, and for such other purposes as will facilitate and increase the
14		business of cargo airport complexes.
15	<u>(5)</u>	To rent, lease, buy, own, acquire, mortgage, otherwise encumber, and
16		dispose of such property, real or personal, as the Authority may deem
17		proper to carry out the purposes and provisions of this Chapter or all or
18		any of them, such powers, including the power of eminent domain, to
19		be exercised without review or concurrence by the Council of State;
20	<u>(6)</u>	To acquire, construct, maintain, equip and operate any structure, and
21		facilities necessary or beneficial for the convenient use of the same in
22		the aid of commerce, including the construction of beltline roads and
23		highways and bridges thereon, necessary or useful in connection with
24		the business of the Authority and shipping and transportation facilities
25		incident thereto, and useful or convenient for the use of the Authority,
26		including electronic cargo transfer systems and mass transit systems;
27	<u>(7)</u>	To appoint an executive director, whose salary shall be fixed by the
28		Authority, to serve at its pleasure. The executive director or his
29		designee shall appoint, employ, dismiss and, within the limits of
30		available funding, fix the compensation of such other employees as he
31		deems necessary to carry out the purposes of this Chapter. There shall
32		be an executive committee consisting of the chairman of the Authority
33		and two other members elected annually by the Authority. The
34		executive committee shall be vested with authority to do all acts which
35		are authorized by the bylaws of the Authority. Members of the
36		executive committee shall serve until their successors are elected;
37	<u>(8)</u>	To establish an office for the transaction of its business at such place
38		or places as, in the opinion of the Authority, shall be advisable or
39		necessary in carrying out the purposes of this Chapter;
40	<u>(9)</u>	To create and operate such agencies and departments as the Authority
41		may deem necessary or useful for the furtherance of any of the
42		purposes of this Chapter;
43	<u>(10)</u>	To pay all necessary costs and expenses involved in and incident to the
44		formation and organization of the Authority, and incident to the

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1		administration and operation thereof, and to pay all other costs and
2		expenses reasonably necessary or expedient in carrying out and
3		accomplishing the purposes of this Chapter;
4	<u>(11)</u>	To apply for, accept and administer loans and grants of money from
5		any federal agency or the State of North Carolina or any political
6		subdivision thereof or from any public or private sources available for
7		any and all of the purposes authorized in this Chapter, and to expend
8		the same in accordance with the directions and requirements attached
9		thereto, or imposed thereon by any such federal agency, the State of
10		North Carolina, or any political subdivision thereof, or any public or

For the acquiring of any property, the Authority shall have the right and power to 4 acquire the same by purchase, by negotiation, by gift, by devise, or by eminent domain. 5 6 Should it elect to exercise the right of eminent domain, proceedings shall be maintained 7 by and in the name of the Authority, and it may proceed in the manner provided by the 8 general laws of the State of North Carolina for the procedure by any county, 9 municipality, or authority organized under the laws of this State, or by the Board of 10 Transportation, or in any other manner provided by law, as the Authority may, in its discretion, elect. The Authority's power of eminent domain shall apply to property of 11 12 persons. State agencies, or units of local government already devoted to public use. Transfer of land owned by the State shall not be subject to review or approval by the 13 14 Governor and Council of State, and the Secretary of the Department of Administration 15 is authorized to execute and deliver a deed transferring fee simple title for such property 16 to the Authority. 17 The Authority may exchange any property or properties acquired under the authority 18 of this Chapter for other property, or properties usable in carrying out the powers hereby 19 conferred, and also may remove from lands needed for its purposes and reconstruct on 20 other locations, buildings, terminals, or other structures, upon the payment of just 21 compensation, if in its judgment, it is necessary or expedient so to do in order to carry out any of its plans for development, under the authorization of this Chapter. 22 23 "§ 159J-8. Police power. 24 The jurisdiction of the Authority in any cargo airport or industrial properties (a) 25 within the State shall extend to all cargo airport sites and all other properties owned by or under control of the Authority. 26 All the provisions of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes relating to the use of 27 (b)the highways of the State and the operation of motor vehicles thereon are hereby made 28 29 applicable to the streets, alleys, and driveways on the properties owned by or under the 30 control of the Authority. Any person violating any of the provisions of said Chapter in or on such streets, alleys, or driveways shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished as 31 32 therein prescribed. 33 The Authority may make such reasonable rules, regulations, and adopt such (c)additional ordinances with respect to the use of the streets, alleys, driveways, and to the 34 35 establishment of parking areas of the properties of the Authority and relating to the 36 safety and welfare of persons using the property of the Authority.
