A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO AMEND THE GENERAL STATUTES CO

AN ACT TO AMEND THE GENERAL STATUTES CONCERNING RESIDENT INSPECTOR RULES AT SPECIAL PURPOSE COMMERCIAL HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. G.S. 130A-295.02(j) reads as rewritten:

The Commission may shall adopt rules establishing reasonable times and "(i) frequencies for the presence of a resident inspector on less than a full-time basis at special purpose commercial hazardous waste facilities which manage limited quantities of hazardous waste. facilities pursuant to this section. For purposes of this subsection, special purpose commercial hazardous waste facilities include: a facility which manages limited quantities of hazardous waste; a facility which limits its hazardous waste management activities to reclamation or recycling, including energy or materials recovery or a facility which stores hazardous waste primarily for use at such facilities; or a facility which is determined to be low risk under rules adopted by the Commission pursuant to this subsection. Rules providing for resident inspectors on less than a full-time basis shall be based on such factors as the smallness of the facility. The rules shall be based on factors including, but not limited to, the size of the facility, the type of treatment or storage being performed, the nature and volume of waste being treated, treated or stored, the uniformity, similarity, or lack of diversity of the waste streams, the predictability of the nature of the waste streams and their treatability, whether the facility utilizes automated monitoring or safety devices which adequately perform functions that would otherwise be performed by a resident inspector, the fact that reclamation or recycling is being performed at the facility, and the compliance history of the facility and its

- 2 inspection at all times. The Commission rules shall specify a minimum number of
- 3 inspections during such times as the facility is in operation, undergoing any
- 4 maintenance or repair, or undergoing any test or calibration."
- 5 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
