2	AN ACT TO ADDRESS MANAGEMENT ACCOUNTABILITY AND STAFF		
3	DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR SCHOOL		
4	ADMINISTRATORS.		
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
6	Section 1. G.S. 115C-12(9) reads as rewritten:		
7	"(9) Miscellaneous Powers and Duties. – All the powers and duties		
8	exercised by the State Board of Education shall be in conformity with		
9	the Constitution and subject to such laws as may be enacted from time		
10	to time by the General Assembly. Among such duties are:		
11	a. To certify and regulate the grade and salary of teachers and		
12	other school employees.		
13	b. To adopt and supply textbooks.		
14	c. To adopt rules requiring all local boards of education to		
15	implement the Basic Education Program on an incremental		
16	basis within funds appropriated for that purpose by the General		
17	Assembly and by units of local government.		
18	The Board shall develop a State accreditation program that meets or		
19	exceeds the standards and requirements of the Basic Education		
20	Program. The Board shall require each local school administrative unit		
21	to comply with the State accreditation program to the extent that funds		
22	have been made available to the local school administrative unit for		
23	implementation of the Basic Education Program.		

1	The	Board shall use the State accreditation program to monitor the	
2	imple	mentation of the Basic Education Program.	
3	c1.	To issue an annual 'report card' for the State and for each local	
4		school administrative unit, assessing each unit's efforts to	
5		improve student performance and taking into account progress	
6		over the previous years' level of performance and the State's	
7		performance in comparison with other states. This assessment	
8		shall take into account demographic, economic, and other	
9		factors that have been shown to affect student performance.	
10	<u>c2.</u>	The State Board of Education shall, with the advice of the	
11		Department of Public Instruction, develop management	
12		accountability indicators to measure the efficiency and	
13		appropriate use of staff in each school and at the administrative	
14		office. Staff development for school administrators shall be a	
15		high priority of the Department of Public Instruction.	
16	d.	To formulate rules and regulations for the enforcement of the	
17		compulsory attendance law.	
18	e.	To manage and operate a system of insurance for public school	
19	_	property, as provided in Article 38 of this Chapter.	
20	In making substantial policy changes in administration, curriculum		
21	or programs the Board should conduct hearings throughout the regions		
22	of the State, whenever feasible, in order that the public may be heard		
23	•	ding these matters."	
24		pter 116 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the

26	"§ 116-11.2. Duties regarding programs in education administration.		
27	The Board of Governors shall direct the constituent institutions with programs in
