2	AN ACT TO PROHIBIT CERTAIN ACTS REGARDING PAINTS AND SOLVENTS
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	Section 1. Part 2A of Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the General Statutes
5	amended by adding a new section to read:
6	" <u>§ 130A-309.29. Prohibited acts regarding paints and solvents.</u>
7	(a) No person may knowingly:
8	(1) Collect, transport, store, recycle, use, or dispose of paints or solven
9	in any manner which endangers the public health or welfare.
10	(2) Discharge paints or solvents into sewers, drainage systems, sept
11	tanks, surface waters, groundwaters, watercourses, or marine waters.
12	(3) Dispose of paints or solvents in landfills in the State unless suc
13	disposal has been approved by the Department.
14	(4) Mix paints or solvents with solid waste that is to be disposed of
15	landfills.
16	(5) Mix paints or solvents with hazardous substances that make
17	unsuitable for recycling or beneficial use.
18	(b) A person who violates subsection (a) of this section shall be guilty of
19	misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished as provided by G.S. 130A-25(
20	and G.S. 14-3.
21	(c) <u>A person who disposes of paints or solvents in a landfill where such paints of the solution of the soluti</u>
22	solvents have been mixed with other solid waste which may be lawfully disposed of
23	such landfill, and who is without knowledge that such solid waste has been mixed with
24	paints or solvents, is not guilty of a violation under this section.

- 1 (d) Paints or solvents shall not be used for purposes that have the potential to 2 release paints or solvents into the environment."
 - Sec. 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 1993.
