1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO ISSUE
3	REGISTRATION PLATES DEPICTING VARIOUS HISTORICAL
4	ATTRACTIONS IN NORTH CAROLINA AND PROVIDING FOR THE
5	DISTRIBUTION OF THE INCOME FROM THE SALE OF THE PLATES.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 20-79.4 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 20-79.4. Special registration plates.
9	(a) <u>Types. General. – Upon application and payment of the required registration</u>
10	fees, a person may obtain from the Division a special registration plate for a motor
11	vehicle registered in that person's name if the person qualifies for the registration plate.
12	A special registration plate, with the exception of a personalized registration plate, may
13	not be issued for a vehicle registered under the International Registration Plan or for a
14	commercial truck. A holder of a special registration plate who becomes ineligible for
15	the plate, for whatever reason, must return the special plate within 30 days.
16	(b) The Division shall issue the following types of special registration plates:
17	(1) Administrative Officer of the Courts. – Issuable to the Director of the
18	Administrative Office of the Courts. The plate shall bear the phrase 'J-
19	20'.
20	(2) Amateur Radio Operator. – Issuable to an amateur radio operator who
21	holds an unexpired and unrevoked amateur radio license issued by the

1		Federal Communications Commission and who asserts to the Division
2		that a portable transceiver is carried in the vehicle. The plate shall
3		bear the phrase 'Amateur Radio.' The plate shall bear the operator's
4		official amateur radio call letters, or call letters with numerical or letter
5		suffixes so that an owner of more than one vehicle may have the call
6		letters on each.
7	(3)	Civil Air Patrol Member. – Issuable to an active member of the North
8		Carolina Wing of the Civil Air Patrol. The plate shall bear the phrase
9		'Civil Air Patrol'. A plate issued to an officer member shall begin with
10		the number '201' and the number shall reflect the seniority of the
11		member; a plate issued to an enlisted member, a senior member, or a
12		cadet member shall begin with the number '501'.
13	(4)	Class D Citizen's Radio Station Operator Issuable to a Class D
14		citizen's radio station operator licensed by the Federal
15		Communications Commission. The plate shall bear the operator's
16		official Class D citizen's radio station call letters.
17	(5)	Clerk of Superior Court Issuable to a clerk of superior court. The
18		plate shall bear the phrase 'Clerk Superior Court' and the letter 'C'
19		followed by a number that indicates the county the clerk serves.
20	(6)	Coast Guard Auxiliary Member. – Issuable to an active member of the
21		United States Coast Guard Auxiliary. The plate shall bear the phrase
22		'Coast Guard Auxiliary'.
23	<u>(6a)</u>	Collegiate Insignia Plate Issuable to the registered owner of a motor
24		vehicle in accordance with G.S. 20-81.12. The plate may bear a
25		phrase or an insignia representing a North Carolina public or private
26		<u>college or university.</u>
27	(7)	Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient Issuable to a recipient of
28		the Congressional Medal of Honor.
29	(8)	Disabled Veteran. – Issuable to a veteran of the armed forces of the
30		United States who suffered a 100% service-connected disability.
31	(9)	District Attorney Issuable to a North Carolina or United States
32		District Attorney. The plate issuable to a North Carolina district
33		attorney shall bear the letters 'DA' followed by a number that
34		represents the prosecutorial district the district attorney serves. The
35		plate for a United States attorney shall bear the phrase 'U.S. Attorney'
36		followed by a number that represents the district the attorney serves,
37		with 1 being the Eastern District, 2 being the Middle District, and 3
38		being the Western District.
39	(10)	) Fire Department or Rescue Squad Member. – Issuable to an active
40		regular member or volunteer member of a fire department, rescue
41		squad, or both a fire department and rescue squad. The plate shall
42		bear the words 'Firefighter', 'Rescue Squad', or 'Firefighter-Rescue
43		Squad'.

24	(16)	Military Reservist. – Issuable to a member of a reserve component
25		of the armed forces of the United States. The plate shall bear the
26 27		name and insignia of the appropriate reserve component. Plates shall be numbered sequentially for members of a component with
27		the numbers 1 through 5000 reserved for officers, without regard to
29		rank.
30	(17)	National Guard Member Issuable to an active or a retired
31		member of the North Carolina National Guard. The plate shall
32		bear the phrase 'National Guard'. A plate issued to an active
33		member shall bear a number that reflects the seniority of the
34		member; a plate issued to a commissioned officer shall begin with
35		the number '1'; a plate issued to a noncommissioned officer with a real of $E_{7}^{7}$ $E_{8}^{8}$ or $E_{9}^{8}$ shall begin with the number '1601'; a plate

1		Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. The plate will bear the phrase
2		'Pearl Harbor Survivor' and the insignia of the Pearl Harbor
3		Survivors' Association.
4	(20)	Personalized. – Issuable to the registered owner of a motor vehicle.
5		The plate will bear the letters or letters and numbers requested by
6		the owner. The Division may refuse to issue a plate with a letter
7		combination that is offensive to good taste and decency. The
8		Division may not issue a plate that duplicates another plate.
9	(21)	Prisoner of War. – Issuable to a member or veteran member of the
10		armed forces of the United States who has been captured and held
11		prisoner by forces hostile to the United States while serving in the
12		armed forces.
13	(22)	Purple Heart Recipient. – Issuable to a recipient of the Purple Heart
14		award. The plate shall bear the phrase 'Purple Heart Veteran,
15		Combat Wounded' and the letters 'PH'.
16	(23)	State Government Official Issuable to elected and appointed
17		members of State government in accordance with G.S. 20-79.5.
18	(24)	Street Rod Owner Issuable to the registered owner of a
19	( )	modernized private passenger motor vehicle manufactured prior to

29	availability of the special plates from the Account.
30	The Collegiate and Historical Attractions Account is established. The Account
31	consists of the revenue derived from the remainder of the additional fee collected for a
32	collegiate insignia registration plate and an historical attractions registration plate.
33	(b) Initial Distribution of Proceeds. – After deducting the costs of the special
34	registration plates from the Fund, the Secretary of Transportation may allocate and
35	reserve up to one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to the Department of
36	Transportation each fiscal year for the purpose of traffic control at major events as
37	provided for by G.S. 136-44.2. Any funds allocated for traffic control that are neither
38	used nor obligated at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the Fund and be used in
39	accordance with subsection (c) of this section.
40	(c) Use of Remaining Proceeds. The remaining revenue in the Fund shall be
41	transferred quarterly as follows: Distribution of Other Proceeds. – The Division shall
42	credit one-half of the revenue derived from the additional fee collected for a
43	personalized registration plate to the Recreation and Natural Heritage Trust Fund
44	established under G.S. 113-77.7. The Division shall transfer the revenue in the

5	fee imposed by G.S. 20-79.7 for this plate to the Collegiate and Historical Attractions
6	Account. The Division must transfer the money derived from the sale of these plates
7	quarterly to the organization named below in proportion to the number of historical
8	attractions plates sold representing that organization.
9	(1) Cape Hatteras Lighthouse. – The revenue derived from the special
10	plate shall be transferred quarterly to the Board of Directors of the

6 (g) The Division must receive 300 or more applications for a collegiate license 7 plate for a college or university before a collegiate license plate may be developed for 8 that college or university."

9 Sec. 4. The Board of Directors of the Graveyard of the Atlantic Museum and 10 the Board of Directors of Old Salem, Incorporated, may submit applications for their respective special plates to the Division of Motor Vehicles requesting that the initial 11 12 plates bearing the numerals "1"through "100"be issued to the owners named in the 13 applications. The applications must be submitted to the Division on or before January 14 1, 1994. The Board of Directors of the Graveyard of the Atlantic Museum and the 15 Board of Directors of Old Salem, Incorporated, may accept donations from the 16 applicants for the Atlantic Museum and Old Salem, Incorporated.

17 Sec. 5. Section 4 of this act is effective upon ratification. The remainder of 18 this act becomes effective January 1, 1994.
