AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO PROVIDE STATE MANDATED

VACCINES WITHOUT CHARGE TO PHYSICIANS AND OTHER

AUTHORIZED HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Notwithstanding G.S. 130A-433, the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources shall provide, without charge, vaccines for immunizations required by G.S. 130A-152 to physicians who are licensed to practice medicine in this State and who administer immunizations as authorized under G.S. 130A-153, and to other health care providers authorized to administer immunizations required by G.S. 130A-152. A physician or other health care provider who receives vaccines from the State without charge may not charge the patient for the vaccine, but may charge a reasonable fee for administering it.

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, the sum of \$2,626,732 for the 1991-92 fiscal year, and the sum of \$4,466,138 for the 1992-93 fiscal year, to implement this act.

Sec. 3. Section 1 of this act becomes effective January 1, 1992. Section 2 of this act becomes effective July 1, 1991.
