10	course of carrying	ng out its duties and responsibilities under this Chapter is confidential

12	<u>(1)</u>	Information which the Department determines is entitled to
13		confidential treatment as business information, including but not
14		limited to trade secrets or commercial or financial information. The
15		Department shall not make a determination that information is entitled
16		to confidential treatment under this subdivision unless the person
17		submitting the information specifically requests that the Department
18		make such determination.
19	<u>(2)</u>	Information requested from or provided by a federal or State agency
20		under a claim of confidentiality.
21	<u>(3)</u>	Information compiled in anticipation of enforcement or criminal
22		proceedings, but only to the extent disclosure could reasonably be
23		expected to interfere with the institution of such proceedings.

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1	(b) Confidential information may be disclosed to officers, employees, or			
2	authorized representatives of federal or State agencies if such disclosure is necessary to			
3	carry out a proper function of the Department or the requesting agency or when relevant			
4	in any proceeding under this Chapter.			
5	(c) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section or as otherwise provided			
6	by law, any officer or employee of the Department who knowingly discloses			
7	information designated as confidential under this section shall be guilty of a			
8	misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or			
9	imprisonment for not more than two years or both and shall be removed from office or			
10	discharged from employment.			
11	(d) As used in this section, the term 'trade secret' has the same meaning as in			
12	<u>G.S. 66-152.</u> "

16	(a) For the purposes of this Article, upon a showing satisfactory to the			
17	Department by a person that all or any part of records, reports or information to which			
18	the Department has access under G.S. 130A-17, would divulge information entitled to			
19	protection under subsection (b), the Department shall consider the information			
20	confidential in accordance with the purposes of that subsection, except that the record,			
21	report or information may be disclosed to other officers, employees or authorized			
22	representatives of the Department concerned with carrying out this Article or when			
23	relevant in any proceeding under this Article. The following information received or			
24	prepared by the Department in the course of carrying out its duties and responsibilities			
25	under this Article is confidential information and shall not be subject to disclosure under			
26	<u>G.S. 132-6:</u>

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1 official duties or by reason of examination or investigation made by, or return, report or record 2 made to or filed with the Department which information concerns or relates to the trade secrets, 3 or to the identity, confidential statistical data, amount or source of any income, profits, losses, 4 or expenditures of any person, firm, partnership, corporation, or association; or permits any 5 income return or copy or any book containing any abstract or its particulars to be seen or 6 examined by any person except as provided in subsection (a) shall be guilty of a misdemeanor 7 and fined not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisoned not more than two years 8 or both; and shall be removed from office or employment. 9 Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section or as otherwise provided (c) by law, any officer or employee of the Department who knowingly discloses 10 information designated as confidential under this section shall be guilty of a 11 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or 12 imprisonment for not more than two years or both and shall be removed from office or 13 discharged from employment. 14 15 As used in this section, the term 'trade secret' has the same meaning as in (d)G.S. 66-152." 16
