2	AN ACT TO INCREASE THE RETIREMENT FORMULA FOR THE MEMBERS OF
3	THE COUNCIL OF STATE WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE TEACHERS' AND
4	STATE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 135-5(b12) reads as rewritten:
7	"(b12) Service Retirement Allowance of Members Retiring on or after July 1, 1990.
8	- Upon retirement from service in accordance with subsection (a) above, on or after
9	July 1, 1990, a member shall receive the following service retirement allowance:
10	(1) A member who is a law enforcement officer or an eligible former law
11	enforcement officer shall receive a service retirement allowance
12	computed as follows:
13	a. If the member's service retirement date occurs on or after his
14	55th birthday, and completion of five years of creditable service
15	as a law enforcement officer, or after the completion of 30 years
16	of creditable service, the allowance shall be equal to one and
17	sixty-four hundredths percent (1.64%) of his average final
18	compensation, multiplied by the number of years of his
19	creditable service. service, other than as a member of the
20	Council of State, plus three percent (3%) of his average final
21	compensation, multiplied by the number of years of his
22	creditable service as a member of the Council of State.
23	However, in no event shall the annual allowance payable to any
24	member pursuant to this subdivision, prior to any reduction for

2			seventy-five percent (75%) of the highest annual compensation
3			earned by the member.
4		b.	This allowance shall also be governed by the provisions of G.S.
5			135-5(b9)(1)b.
6	(2)	A me	mber who is not a law enforcement officer or an eligible former
7		law e	inforcement officer shall receive a service retirement allowance
8		comp	uted as follows:
9		a.	If the member's service retirement date occurs on or after his
10			65th birthday upon the completion of five years of creditable
11			service or after the completion of 30 years of creditable service
12			or on or after his 60th birthday upon the completion of 25 years
13			of creditable service, the allowance shall be equal to one and
14			sixty-four hundredths percent (1.64%) of his average final
15			compensation, multiplied by the number of years of creditable
16			service. service, other than as a member of the Council of State,
17			plus three percent (3%) of his average final compensation,
18			multiplied by the number of years of his creditable service as a
19			member of the Council of State. However, in no event shall the
20			annual allowance payable to any member pursuant to this
21			subdivision, prior to any reduction for early retirement or for an
22			optional mode of payment, exceed seventy-five percent (75%)
23			of the highest annual compensation earned by the member.
24		b.	This allowance shall also be governed by the provisions of G.S.
25			135-5(b9)(2)b. c. and d."
