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| 2 | AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO INCREASE THE LEVEL OF GRANTS- |
| 3 | IN-AID TO PRIVATE CHILD-CARING INSTITUTIONS. |
| 4 | Whereas, the State of North Carolina is dependent on the private child-caring |
| 5 | institutions to provide residential care to foster children who need the special resources |
| 6 | of the private institutions; and |
| 7 | Whereas, the private child-caring institutions receive partial reimbursement |
| 8 | for the cost of care to the foster children placed by county departments of social |
| 9 | services, including \$3,180 per child in foster care board payments plus a State grant-in- |
| 10 | aid (GIA); and |
| 11 | Whereas, the 1989-90 GIA appropriation of \$4,890,309 provided \$6,376 for |
| 12 | each of the 765 eligible children; and |
| 13 | Whereas, the 1990-91 GIA appropriation of \$4,945,625 provided only \$5,704 |
| 14 | for each of the 867 eligible children; and |
| 15 | Whereas, the number of eligible children for 1991-92 is expected to be 896; |
| 16 | and |
| 17 | Whereas, the 1991-93 proposed budget includes no increase in the GIA, |
| 18 | resulting in a further reduction to \$5,520 for each eligible child, which means the State |
| 19 | will reimburse only thirty-nine and one-tenth percent (39.1%) of the cost of care for the |
| 20 | GIA eligible children; and |
| 21 | Whereas, the private child-caring institutions care for an additional 358 |
| 22 | children placed by their parents, and for whom no public funds are received; Now, |

| 24 | The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: |

1 Section 1. In addition to any other funds appropriated for this purpose by 2 law, there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Human 3 Resources the sum of \$2,136,031 for the 1991-92 fiscal year and the sum of \$2,136,031 4 for the 1992-93 fiscal year to increase the level of grants-in-aid to private child-caring 5 institutions so that the State is reimbursing the private child-caring institutions fifty 6 percent (50%) of the actual cost of care for the 867 eligible children.

Sec. 2. The funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act shall be paid by the
Department of Human Resources to the eligible child-caring institutions according to
the provisions of the North Carolina Administrative Code, Section 10, Subchapter 41M,
for the payment of grants-in-aid to private child-caring institutions.

11 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1991.
