6		H. Definitions.
7	As used in th	
8	(1)	'Approved refrigerant recycling equipment' means equipment that is
9	<u> </u>	certified by an independent standards testing organization, approved
10		by the Secretary, as meeting the organization's standards applicable to
11		equipment for the extraction and reclamation of refrigerant from air
12		conditioners;
13	<u>(2)</u>	'Business establishment' means an individual, partnership, corporation,
14		or other entity that provides services relating to motor vehicle air
15		conditioners, air conditioners for buildings, or refrigeration equipment;
16	<u>(3)</u>	'Motor vehicle air conditioner' means any mechanical vapor
17		compression equipment used to cool any compartment of a motor
18		vehicle;
19	<u>(4)</u>	'Properly using approved refrigerant recycling equipment' means using
20		such equipment in conformity with the standards set by an independent
21		standards testing organization that has been approved by the Secretary,
22		establishing the recommended service procedure for containment of
23		<u>refrigerant;</u>
24	<u>(5)</u>	'Properly trained and certified' means trained and certified in the
25		proper use of approved refrigerant recycling equipment under a
26		certification program by an independent standards testing organization
27		that has been approved by the Administrator;
28	<u>(6)</u>	'Refrigeration equipment' means mechanical vapor compression
29		refrigeration equipment except for a motor vehicle air conditioner.
30		I. Servicing motor vehicle air conditioners; certification.
31	<u>(1)</u>	After January 1, 1992, no business establishment shall perform motor
32		vehicle repair that releases or may release CFC's from a motor vehicle
33		air conditioner, or shall install or service a motor vehicle air
34		conditioner that employs CFC's unless the personnel authorized by it
35		to perform such activities have been properly trained and certified and
36		use approved refrigerant recycling equipment.
37	<u>(2)</u>	After January 1, 1992, each business establishment that performs
38		service on motor vehicle air conditioners that employ CFC's shall
39		certify to the Secretary that it has acquired and is properly using
40		approved refrigerant recycling equipment in any service on a motor
41		vehicle air conditioner involving refrigerant for such air conditioner
42		and that it and any other person authorized by it to perform such
43		service is properly trained and certified.

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1	<u>(3)</u>	Each certification shall contain the name and address of the business
2	<u> </u>	establishment and the serial number of each unit of approved recycling
3		equipment acquired by the establishment and shall be signed by the
4		owner or other responsible corporate officer.
5	" <u>§ 143-215.11</u> 4	1J. Servicing refrigeration equipment; certification.
6	<u>(1)</u>	After July 1, 1992, no business establishment shall install or service
7		refrigeration equipment that contains CFC's unless its personnel
8		authorized by it to perform such activities have been properly trained
9		and certified and use approved refrigerant recycling equipment.
10	<u>(2)</u>	Not later than the date two years after the enactment of this section,
11		each business establishment that installs or performs service on
12		refrigeration equipment shall certify to the Secretary that:
13		a. It has acquired and is properly using approved refrigerant
14		recycling equipment in any service on refrigeration equipment
15		that contains CFC's and that it and any other person authorized
16		by it to perform such service is properly trained and certified;
17		and
18		b. The business establishment does not use CFC's to clean the
19		exterior surfaces of refrigeration equipment.
20	<u>(3)</u>	Each certification shall contain the name and address of the business
21		establishment and the serial number of each unit of approved recycling
22		equipment acquired by the establishment and shall be signed by the
23	119 140 015 114	owner or other responsible corporate officer.
24		<b>4K.</b> Servicing air conditioners in buildings; certification.
25	<u>(1)</u>	After July 1, 1992, no business establishment shall perform repair on
26 27		air conditioners in a building when such repair releases or may release
27 28		<u>CFC's from an air conditioner, or shall install or service an air</u> conditioner when such air conditioner employs CFC's unless the
28 29		personnel authorized by it to perform such activities have been
30		properly trained and certified and use approved refrigerant recycling
31		equipment.
32	<u>(2)</u>	After July 1, 1992, each business establishment that performs service
33	<u>(2)</u>	on air conditioners that employ CFC's shall certify to the Secretary that
34		it has acquired and is properly using approved refrigerant recycling
35		equipment in any service on an air conditioner involving refrigerant
36		for such air conditioner and that it and any other person authorized by
37		it to perform such service is properly trained and certified.
38	<u>(3)</u>	Each certification shall contain the name and address of the business
39	<del>//</del>	establishment and the serial number of each unit of approved recycling
40		equipment acquired by the establishment and shall be signed by the
41		owner or other responsible corporate officer.

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1	(b) After January 1, 1992, no person shall sell in this State CFC-propelled plastic		
2	party streamers and noise horns, CFC-containing cleaning fluids for electronic and		
3	photographic equipment, or any other consumer products which are capable of releasing		
4	<u>CFC's into the atmosphere when, as determined by the Secretary, these products are</u>		
5	nonessential.		
6	(c) After January 1, 1992, no person shall engage in any activity which results in		
7	the person knowingly releasing CFC's into the air.		
8	"§ 143-215.114M. Duties of State agencies.		
9	(a) The Department shall survey products that employ or are manufactured with		
10	CFC's. The Department shall report to the General Assembly no later than January 1,		
11	1993, such report to include the results of its survey and the Department's		
12	recommendations as to which products to ban the sale or manufacture of due to the		
13	product's nonessential use or potential to deplete ozone.		
14	(b) After January 1, 1991, the Department of Administration and the Department		
15	of Transportation, shall not perform motor vehicle repairs on State-owned motor		
16	vehicles when such repair releases or may release CFC's from a motor vehicle air		
17	conditioner, and shall not install or service a motor vehicle air conditioner in a State-		
18	owned motor vehicle when such air conditioner employs CFC's unless the personnel		
19	authorized by it to perform such activities have been properly trained and certified and		
20	use approved refrigerant recycling equipment.		
21	(c) The Department of Administration and the Department of Transportation		
22	shall phase out the purchase of products that contain CFC's or that are manufactured		
23	with CFC's.		
24	(d) The Department of Administration shall not install or service an air		
25	conditioner in a State building when such air conditioner employs CFC's unless the		
26	personnel authorized by it to perform such activities have been properly trained and		
27	certified and use approved refrigerant recycling equipment.		
28	(e) <u>The Department of Community Colleges shall establish courses to properly</u>		
29	train and certify persons to repair and install motor vehicle air conditioners,		
30	refrigerators, and air conditioners for buildings that employ CFC's and to properly use		
31	approved refrigerant recycling equipment.

33	(a) <u>A person who violates this Part shall be punished by a civil penalty of not</u>		
34	more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per day of violation.
