18	The Joint Committee shall consist of six sitting members of the General Assembly.
19	Three shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate from the
20	membership of the Senate and three shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
21	Representatives from the membership of the House. Members will serve at the pleasure
22	of their appointing officer and any vacancies occurring on the Joint Committee shall be
23	filled by the presiding officer of the appropriate house. The initial membership of the Joint
24	Committee shall consist of the membership of the Utility Review Committee on June 28, 1985.
25	A Senate cochairman and a House cochairman shall be elected by the Joint Committee from
26	among its members. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall designate one
27	Senator to serve as cochairman and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
28	designate one Representative to serve as cochairman. A quorum shall consist of four
29	members."Sec. 2. G.S. 120-70.3(8) reads as rewritten:

35	which the General Assembly has assigned to another legislative

37	Sec. 7. This act shall not be construed to affect the validity or term of any
38	appointment made prior to the effective date of this act. This act is effective on and
39	after 30 January 1991.
