SENATE BILL 824

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A COUNTY MAY RETAIN TWENTY-FIVE
2 PERCENT OF ANY MONEY AND PROPERTY CONFISCATED FROM
3 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE VIOLATIONS FOR LOCAL DRUG
4 ABATEMENT ACTIVITIES.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. G.S. 90-112 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

8 "(g) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, twenty-five percent (25%) of
9 monies and twenty-five percent (25%) of the value of property confiscated in the
10 enforcement of the provisions of this Article may be retained by the county in which the
11 money or property was seized. These funds shall be deposited in a special county fund
12 to be used for any of the following purposes: (i) to support Drug Abuse Resistance
13 Education (DARE), (ii) to fund undercover law enforcement activities relating to drug
14 offenses, and (iii) to expand drug abatement activities in the sheriff's department
15 including the training and salary expenses for drug investigators and the purchase and
16 training of drug dogs."

17 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
