8	<u>(a)</u>	<u>As us</u>	sed in this section, a 'special emphasis inspection' is an inspection by the
9	Departm	ent's oc	ccupational safety and health division that is:
10		<u>(1)</u>	Scheduled randomly and more frequently than a general schedule
11			inspection, and
12		<u>(2)</u>	Scheduled because of an employer's high frequency of violations of
13			safety and health laws or because of an employer's high risk or high
14			rate of work-related fatalities or work-related serious injuries or
15			<u>illnesses.</u>
16	<u>(b)</u>	The 1	Department shall develop and implement a special emphasis inspection
17	program	that tar	gets for special emphasis inspection employers who:
18		<u>(1)</u>	Have a high rate of serious or willful violations of any standard, rule,
19			order, or other requirement under this Article, or of regulations
20			prescribed pursuant to the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Act
21			of 1970, in a one-year period, or
22		<u>(2)</u>	Have a high rate of work-related deaths, or a high rate of work-related
23			serious injuries or illnesses, in a one-year period, or

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1	(3) Are engaged in a type of industry determined by the Department to be
2	at high risk for serious or fatal work-related injuries or illnesses, or
3	(4) Have an experience modification rating established for workers'
4	compensation premium rates that is significantly higher than the State
5	average. For purposes of targeting employers under this subdivision,
6	the Department, in consultation with the North Carolina Rate Bureau
7	and the Commissioner of Insurance, shall set the experience
8	modification rating threshold for determining a rating that is
9	significantly higher than the State average.
10	To identify employers for special emphasis inspections, the Department shall use the
11	most current data available from its own database and from other sources, including
12	State departments, divisions, boards, commissions, and other State entities. The
13	Department shall ensure that every employer targeted for special emphasis inspection is
14	inspected at least one time within the two-year period following targeting of the
15	employer by the Department. The Department shall update its special emphasis
16	inspection records at least annually.
17	(c) The Director shall make information about the special emphasis inspection
18	program available to all employers in the State at least 30 days prior to the date of
19	implementation of the program.
20	(d) <u>The Department shall, two years after the initial implementation of the special</u>
21	emphasis inspection program, and annually thereafter, report to the Joint Legislative
22	Commission on Governmental Operations and the Fiscal Research Division the impact
23	that the special emphasis inspection program is having on safety and health compliance
24	and enforcement."
25	Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification. The Department shall begin
26	the development of the special emphasis inspection program immediately upon
27	ratification of this act. The special emphasis inspection program shall become
28	operational not later than July 1, 1993.
