A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ENSURE THAT AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS RECEIVED MENTAL

HEALTH SERVICES IS NOT PREJUDICED WHEN APPLYING FOR INSURANCE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. The Commissioner of Insurance shall ensure that an individual who has received mental health services is not automatically prejudiced when applying for insurance of any sort issued in this State. The Commissioner shall ensure that the standard background checks required of all applicants take into consideration the fact that an individual who has had mental health services and treatment in the past and is no longer receiving them is far more likely to be mentally well than is an individual who has never sought these treatments or services and who will have no such treatments or services show upon the routine background check but who very well may have been in need of these treatments or services for a considerable time.

The Commissioner shall adopt the rules required to implement this act upon consultation with the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services, Department of Human Resources.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1993, and applies to insurance background checks initiated on or after that date.
