7	TO BE SPECIFIC FOR THAT DEALER PLATE.	
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
9	Section	on 1. G.S. 20-79(d), as amended by Section 169.4 of Chapter 321 of the
10	1993 Session Laws and by Section 2 of Chapter 440 of the 1993 Session Laws, reads as	
11	rewritten:	
12	"(d) Restr	ictions on Use A dealer license plate may be displayed only on a
13	motor vehicle th	hat meets all of the following requirements:
14	(1)	Is part of the inventory of the dealer.
15	(2)	Is not consigned to the dealer.
16	(3)	Is covered by liability insurance that meets the requirements of Article
17		9A of this Chapter.
18	(4)	Is not used by the dealer in another business in which the dealer is
19		engaged.
20	(5)	Is driven on a highway by a person who meets the following
21		requirements and who carries a copy of the registration card for the
22		dealer plate displayed on the motor vehicle plates issued to the dealer and

1	any demonstration permit issued to that person while driving the motor
2	vehicle:
3	a. Is an officer of the dealer, an employee of the dealer, or a
4	person to whom the dealer has issued a demonstration permit.
5	b. Is at least 18 years old unless the person is test-driving the
6	vehicle and has a demonstration permit or is an employee of the
7	dealer and regularly works for the dealer at least 15 hours a
8	week.
9	A dealer may issue a demonstration permit for a motor vehicle to a person licensed
10	to drive that type of motor vehicle. A demonstration permit authorizes each person
11	named in the permit to drive the motor vehicle described in the permit for up to 96
12	hours after the time the permit is issued. A dealer may, for good cause, renew a
13	demonstration permit for one additional 96-hour period.
14	A dealer may not lend, rent, lease, or otherwise place a dealer license plate at the
15	disposal of a person except as authorized by this subsection.
16	A dealer who sells, trades, or services farm tractors may use a dealer license plate on
17	a vehicle that is owned by the dealer and is used to haul farm tractors or any other farm-
18	related equipment sold, traded, or serviced by the dealer."
