4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
5	Section 1. Article 24 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes reads as rewritten:

14	(a)	Defin	itions. <u>– As used in this Article certain terms are defined as follows:</u>	
15		(1)	A 'counselor' is a person engaged in the practice of counseling who is	
16			not a Registered Practicing Counselor as defined in this Article.	
17		<u>(1a)</u>	The 'Board' means the Board of Licensed Professional Counselors.	
18		(2)	A 'Registered Practicing Counselor' 'licensed professional counselor' is a	
19			person engaged in the practice of counseling who holds a certificate	
20			license as a Registered Practicing Counselor-licensed professional	
21			counselor issued to him-under the provisions of this Article.

1	(3)	The 'practice of counseling' means holding oneself out to the public as
2		a practicing professional counselor offering counseling services which
3		that include, but are not limited to to, the following:
4		a. Counseling. <u>– Assisting an individual, individuals, groups, and</u>
5		families through the counseling relationship, using a
6		combination of clinical mental health and human development
7		principles, methods, diagnostic procedures, treatment plans, and
8		other psychotherapeutic techniques, to develop an
9		understanding of personal problems, to define goals goals, and
10		to plan action reflecting his or her-the client's interests, abilities,
11		aptitudes, and mental health needs as these are related to
12		personal-social personal-social-emotional concerns, education
13		progress educational progress, and occupations and careers.
14		b. Appraisal Activities. – Administering and interpreting tests for
15		assessment of personal characteristics.
16		c. Consulting Interpreting scientific data and providing
17		guidance and personnel services to individuals, groups groups,
18		or organizations.
19		d. Referral Activities. <u>–</u> Identifying problems requiring referral to
20		other specialists.
21		e. Research Activities Designing, conducting-conducting, and
22		interpreting research with human subjects.
23	<u>(4)</u>	A 'supervisor' means any licensed professional counselor or, when one
24		is inaccessible, an equivalently credentialed mental health
25		professional, as determined by the Board, with a minimum of five
26		years of counseling experience who meets the qualifications
27		established by the Board.

14	<u>(a)</u> <u>It is</u>	not the intent of this Article to regulate members of other regulated			
15	professions wh	o do counseling in the normal course of the practice of their profession.			
16	Accordingly, th	nis Article does not apply to:			
17	<u>(1)</u>	Any person registered, certified, or licensed by the State to practice			
18		any other occupation or profession while rendering counseling services			
19		in the performance of the occupation or profession for which the			
20		person is registered, certified, or licensed.			
21	<u>(2)</u>	Any school counselor certified by the State Board of Education while			
22		counseling within the scope of employment by a board of education or			
23		private school.			
24	<u>(3)</u>	Any student intern or trainee in counseling pursuing a course of study			
25		in counseling in a regionally accredited institution of higher learning			
26		or training institution, if the intern or trainee is a designated 'counselor			
27		intern' and the activities and services constitute a part of the supervised			
28		<u>course of study.</u>			
29	<u>(4)</u>	Any ordained minister or other member of the clergy while acting in a			
30		ministerial capacity.			
31	<u>(5)</u>	Any nonresident temporarily employed in this State to render			
32		counseling services for not more than 30 days in a year, if the person			
33		holds a license or certificate required for counselors in another state.			
34	<u>(6)</u>	Any person employed by State, federal, county, or municipal			
35		government while counseling within the scope of employment.			
36	<u>(7)</u>	Any person performing mental health counseling solely as an			
37		employee of an area facility, as defined in G.S. 122C-3(14)a., if both			
38		of the following apply:			
39		a. The mental health services are provided by a qualified mental			
40		health professional who meets or exceeds the minimum			
41		educational qualifications for licensure as a licensed			
42		professional counselor under this Article.			
43		b. The area facility has obtained written verification from the			
44		following boards that the employee has not had his or her			

1	license, registration, or certification revoked, rescinded, or
2	suspended: the North Carolina Board of Licensed Professional
3	Counselors, the North Carolina State Board of Examiners of
4	Practicing Psychologists, the North Carolina Certification
5	Board for Social Work, and the North Carolina Marital and
6	Family Therapy Certification Board.
7	(b) Persons who claim to be exempt under subsection (a) of this section are
8	prohibited from advertising or offering themselves as 'licensed professional counselors'.
9	(c) Persons licensed under this Article are exempt from rules pertaining to
10	counseling adopted by other occupational licensing boards.
11	"§ 90-333. North Carolina Board of Registered Practicing-Licensed Professional
12	Counselors; appointments; terms; composition.
13	(a) For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Article, there is hereby
14	created the North Carolina Board of Registered Practicing-Licensed Professional
15	Counselors which shall consist of seven members appointed by the Governor in the
16	manner hereinafter prescribed. Any nationally recognized association representing
17	professional counselors may submit recommendations to the Governor for Board
18	membership. The Governor may remove any member of the Board for neglect of duty
19	or malfeasance or conviction of a felony or other crime of moral turpitude, but for no
20	other reason.
21	(b) At least five members of the Board shall be Registered Practicing Counselors
22	licensed professional counselors except that initial appointees shall be persons who
23	meet the educational and experience requirements for registration as Registered Practicing
24	licensure as licensed professional counselors under the provisions of this Article; and
25	two members shall be appointed from the public at large. public-at-large members
26	appointed from the general public. Composition of the Board as to the race and sex of
27	its members shall reflect the composition of the population of the State of North Carolina.
28	State and each member shall reside in a different congressional district.
29	(c) At all times the Board shall include at least two counselors one counselor
30	primarily engaged in counselor education, at least one counselor primarily engaged in the multiple sector and at least two equations are counselor primarily engaged in the
31	the public sector, and at least two counselors one counselor primarily engaged in the
32 33	private sector. sector, and two licensed professional counselors at large.(d) All members of the Board shall be residents of the State of North Carolina,
33 34	and after the establishment of the initial Board, all members, and, with the exception of the
34 35	public members-public-at-large members, shall be registered-licensed by the Board under
36	the provisions of this Article. Professional members of the Board must be actively
37	engaged in the practice of counseling or in the education and training of students in
38	counseling, and have been for at least three years prior to their appointment to the
39	Board. Such The engagement in this activity during the two years preceding the
40	appointment shall have occurred primarily in this State.
41	(e) The term of office of each member of the Board shall be three years;
42	provided, however, that of the members first appointed, three shall be appointed for

provided, however, that of the members first appointed, three shall be appointed for
terms of one year, two for terms of two years, and two for terms of three years. No
member shall serve more than two consecutive three-year terms.

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1 (f) Each term of service on the Board shall expire on the 30th day of June of the 2 year in which the term expires. As the term of a member expires, the Governor shall 3 make the appointment for a full term, or, if a vacancy occurs for any other reason, for 4 the remainder of the unexpired term.

5 (g) Members of the Board shall receive compensation for their services and 6 reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of duties required by this 7 Article, at the rates prescribed in G.S. 93B-5.

8 (h) The Board may employ, subject to the provisions of Chapter 126 of the 9 General Statutes, the necessary personnel for the performance of its functions, and fix 10 their compensation within the limits of funds available to the Board.

11 "§ 90-334. Functions and duties of the Board.

(a) The Board shall administer and enforce the provisions of this Article.

(b) The Board shall elect from its membership, a chairperson, a vice-chairperson,
 and secretary-treasurer, and adopt rules to govern its proceedings. A majority of the
 membership shall constitute a quorum for all Board meetings.

16 (c) The Board shall examine and pass on the qualifications of all applicants for 17 certificates licenses under this Article, and shall issue a certificate license or renewal of 18 license to each successful applicant therefor.

(d) The Board may adopt a seal which may be affixed to all certificates licenses
issued by the Board.

(e) The Board may authorize expenditures deemed necessary to carry out the
provisions of this Article from the fees which it collects, but in no event shall
expenditures exceed the revenues of the Board during any fiscal year. No State
appropriations shall be subject to the administration of the Board.

(f) The Board shall establish and receive fees not to exceed seventy-five dollars
(\$75.00)-one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for initial or renewal application, not to exceed
seventy-five dollars (\$75.00)-one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for examination, and not to
exceed fifteen dollars (\$15.00)-twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for late renewal;-renewal,
maintain Board accounts of all receipts, and make expenditures from Board receipts for
any purpose which is reasonable and necessary for the proper performance of its duties
under this Article.

32 (g) The Board shall have the power to establish or approve study or training 33 courses and to establish reasonable standards for <u>registration_licensure</u> and <u>certificate</u> 34 <u>license</u> renewal, including but not limited to the power to adopt or use examination 35 materials and accreditation standards of any recognized counselor accrediting agency 36 and the power to establish reasonable standards for continuing counselor <u>education</u>; 37 provided that for certificate renewal no examination shall be required.-<u>education</u>.

(h) Subject to the provisions of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, the Board
shall have the power to adopt, amend, or repeal rules and regulations to carry out the
purposes of this Article, including but not limited to the power to adopt ethical and
disciplinary standards.

42 (i) The Board shall not adopt rules to regulate individuals who do not use the title
43 'Registered Practicing Counselor.'- The Board shall establish the criteria for determining the
44 qualifications constituting 'supervised professional practice'.

1	(j) The Board may examine counselor applicants, approve, issue, deny, revoke,			
2	suspend, and renew the licenses of counselor applicants and licensees under this Article,			
3	and conduct hearings in connection with these actions.			
4	(k) The Board shall investigate, subpoena individuals and records, and take			
5	necessary appropriate action to properly discipline persons licensed under this Article			
6	and to enforce this Article.			
7	"§ 90-335. Board general provisions.			
8	The Board shall be subject to the provisions of Chapter 93B of the General Statutes.			
9	"§ 90-336. Title and qualifications for registration. <u>licensure.</u>			
10	(a) Each person desiring to be registered by the Board <u>a licensed professional</u>			
11	counselor shall make application to the Board upon such forms and in such manner as			
12	the Board shall prescribe, together with the required application fee established by the			
13	Board-fee.			
14	(b) The Board shall issue a certificate as 'Registered Practicing Counselor'-license as			
15	<u>'licensed professional counselor'</u> to an applicant who: who meets all of the following			
16	<u>criteria:</u> (1) Use some diene of the fallowing.			
17	(1) <u>Has earned one of the following:</u>			
18	a. <u>A masters degree in counseling from a regionally accredited</u>			
19 20	institution of higher education, which includes a minimum of 48 semester hours.

31	(3)(2) Provides satisfactory evidence of the completion of two years'			
32	experience in the practice of counseling under the direct supervision

35	substituted for two years of experience. Has had no less than two			
36	years of masters or post-masters counseling experience, or of both,			
37	in a professional setting, including a minimum of 2,000 hours of			
38	supervised professional practice as defined by the Board.			
39	(3) Has passed an examination as adopted by the Board.			
40	"§ 90-337. Persons certified credentialed in other states.			
41	A counselor who holds a valid and unrevoked certificate as a Registered Practicing			
42	Counselor, or its equivalent, issued under authority of any state, or the District of			
43	Columbia, and who resides within the State of North Carolina, may perform work			
44	within the State: Provided, that he register with the State Board of Registered Practicing			

Counselors and comply with its rules regarding such registration. Such person may use 1 2 the term 'Counselor' in connection with his name, but may not use the term 'Registered 3 Practicing Counselor' without registering with the Board. The Board may license any person who is currently licensed, certified, or registered by another state if the 4 5 individual has met requirements determined by the Board to be substantially similar to 6 or exceeding those established under this Article. 7 "§ 90-338. Temporary exemption from academic qualifications. Exemptions. 8 Applicants holding certificates of registration as Registered Practicing Counselors 9 and in good standing with the Board shall be issued licenses as licensed professional 10 counselors without meeting the requirements of G.S. 90-336(b). At least 45 days prior to expiration of 28 29 each certificate of registration,-license, the Board shall mail a notice for certificate-license 30 renewal to the person certified-licensed for the current certification-licensure period. - Sec. 4. If any portion of this act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, that 4 5 declaration shall not affect the validity and constitutionality of the remaining portions.
- Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994, except that the Board's rule-6 making authority under this act is effective upon ratification of the act. 7

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
