2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT OF THE CITY OF 3 NEW BERN TO MAKE DECISIONS CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL USE PERMITS UNDER THE CITY'S UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT 4 5 ORDINANCE BY A CONCURRING THREE-FIFTHS MAJORITY VOTE. 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 7

Section 1. G.S. 160A-388(e) reads as rewritten:

The concurring vote of four-fifths of the members of the board shall be 8 "(e) necessary to reverse any order, requirement, decision, or determination of any 9 administrative official charged with the enforcement of an ordinance adopted pursuant 10 to this Part, or to decide in favor of the applicant any matter upon which it is required to 11 pass under any ordinance, or to grant a variance from the provisions of the ordinance. 12 Provided, however, any decision concerning the issuance of a special use permit shall 13 14 be made by the concurring vote of three-fifths of the members of the Board of Adjustment. Every decision of the board shall be subject to review by the superior court 15 by proceedings in the nature of certiorari. Any petition for review by the superior 16 court shall be filed with the clerk of superior court within 30 days after the decision of 17 the board is filed in such office as the ordinance specifies, or after a written copy thereof 18 is delivered to every aggrieved party who has filed a written request for such copy with 19 20 the secretary or chairman of the board at the time of its hearing of the case, whichever is 21 later. The decision of the board may be delivered to the aggrieved party either by personal service or by registered mail or certified mail return receipt requested." 22 Sec. 2. This act applies to the City of New Bern only. 23
