2	AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE GOVERNMENT
3	PERFORMANCE AUDIT COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF
4	STREAMLINING THE REGIONAL ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE FOR
5	PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAMS, AND TO REEXAMINE THE
6	ORGANIZATIONAL PLACEMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAMS IN THE
7	DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT, HEALTH, AND NATURAL
8	RESOURCES.
9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
10	Section 1. Chapter 120 of the General Statutes is amended by adding the
11	following new Article to read:
12	" <u>ARTICLE 22.</u>
13	<b>"STUDY COMMISSION ON THE ORGANIZATION</b>
14	OF PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAMS.
15	" <u>§ 120-190. Commission established; appointment of members.</u>
16	There is established the Study Commission on the Organization of Public Health
17	Programs, which shall consist of 14 members. The membership of the Commission
18	shall be as follows: four Senators and one physician who is not a local health director
19	but who provides health services to citizens through a local or district health
20	department, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; four Representatives
21	and one local health director appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
22	the Secretary of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources or his delegate; the
23	
24	<u>Secretary of Human Resources or his delegate; the State Health Director or his delegate,</u> and one public member appointed by the Governor.
