7	Section 1. G.S. 1-75.4 reads as rewritten:

12	(1)	Local Presence or Status In any action, whether the claim arises	
13		within or without this State, in which a claim is asserted against a party

17		c. Is a domestic corporation; or	
18		d. Is engaged in substantial activity within this State, whether such

20	(2)	Special Jurisdiction Statutes In any action which may be brought

13		this State in the ordinary course of trade.
14	(5)	Local Services, Goods or Contracts. – In any action which:
15	(0)	a. Arises out of a promise, made anywhere to the plaintiff or to
16		some third party for the plaintiff's benefit, by the defendant to
17		perform services within this State or to pay for services to be
18		performed in this State by the plaintiff; or
19		b. Arises out of services actually performed for the plaintiff by the
20		defendant within this State, or services actually performed for
20		the defendant by the plaintiff within this State if such
22		performance within this State was authorized or ratified by the
23		defendant; or
24		c. Arises out of a promise, made anywhere to the plaintiff or to
25		some third party for the plaintiff's benefit, by the defendant to

25 26 27	(9)	Taxes or Assessments. – In any action for the collection of taxes or assessments levied, assessed or otherwise imposed by a taxing authority of this State after the date of ratification of this act.
28 29 30 31 32	(10)	 Insurance or Insurers. – In any action which arises out of a contract of insurance as defined in G.S. 58-1-10 made anywhere between the plaintiff or some third party and the defendant and in addition either: a. The plaintiff was a resident of this State when the event occurred out of which the claim arose; or
33 34 35	(11)	 b. The event out of which the claim arose occurred within this State, regardless of where the plaintiff resided. Personal Representative. – In any action against a personal

2	any kind, direct or indirect, received in this State by oral, written,
3	visual, electronic, or other communication, notwithstanding the
4	communication emanates from out-of-State."
5	Sec. 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1993, and applies to any

6 actions filed on or after that date.
