Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: 9 10 "§ 143-59.1. State policy; preference given to businesses providing employment to rehabilitated prison inmates. 11 12 It is the policy of this State to encourage businesses in the State to provide (a) employment to former prison inmates whenever possible, in order to give those persons 13 an opportunity to become productive members of society. 14 The Secretary of Administration and any State agency authorized to purchase 15 (b)foodstuff or other products, shall, in the purchase of or in the contracting for foods, 16 supplies, materials, equipment, printing or services give preference as far as may be 17 18 practicable to such products or services manufactured or produced by former prison inmates or by businesses that make a practice of providing employment to former prison 19 inmates. However, in giving such preference no sacrifice or loss in price or quality 20 shall be permitted, and preference in all cases shall be given to surplus products or 21 articles produced and manufactured by other State departments, institutions, or agencies 22 which are available for distribution." 23 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification. 24
