BILL SUMMARY: "TO DIRECT THE HEALTH SERVICES COMMISSION TO ADOPT RULES RESTRICTING THE OFFERING OF UNWRAPPED FOOD SAMPLES." Amends GS 130A-248(a3) to require Health Services Comm'n to adopt rules prohibiting offering unwrapped food samples to the general public unless offering and acceptance of samples continuously supervised by agent of preparer or agent of entity on whose premises samples offered. Effective Jan. 1, 1994. Introduced by Bowie.
