"§ 7A-109.2. Judicial sentencing histories.	
(a) In addition to the record-keeping duties assigned to clerks pursuant to G.	<u>S.</u>
7A-109, each clerk shall maintain a register listing the name of each judge of the	ne
superior court and district court divisions and all criminal convictions over which each	
judge has presided, in chronological order beginning with sentences imposed on or aft	<u>er</u>
April 1, 1994. The register shall include the following information for each case:	
(1) The full name and docket number of the case;	
(2) The charges against the defendant;	
(3) The charges for which the defendant was convicted;	
(4) The sentence imposed by the judge; and	
(5) The date the sentence was imposed.	1
(b) The records kept pursuant to this section shall be public records and shall be pub	
open to the inspection of the public during regular office hours and at such other time	<u>es</u>
