A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR FIFTEEN DISPUTE SETTLEMENT CENTERS ACROSS THE STATE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrative Office of the Courts the sum of two hundred seventy-three thousand five hundred dollars (\$273,500) for the 1995-96 fiscal year for new and additional funding for 15 dispute settlement centers throughout the State.

Sec. 2. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be allocated for new funding for the Blue Ridge Dispute Settlement Center. The remaining funds shall be allocated for additional funding as follows:

- (1) \$5,000 for the Alamance County Dispute Settlement Center;
- (2) \$25,000 for the Dispute Settlement Program of Charlotte/Mecklenburg;
- (3) \$10,000 for the Cumberland County Dispute Settlement Center;
- (4) \$10,000 for the Dispute Settlement Center of Cape Fear;
- (5) \$20,000 for the Dispute Settlement Center of Durham County;
- (6) \$13,500 for the Henderson County Dispute Settlement Center;
- (7) \$10,000 for the Mediation Center in Buncombe County;

- 1           (8)    \$20,000 for the Mediation Center of Eastern Carolina;  
2           (9)    \$15,000 for the Mediation Center of Gaston County;  
3           (10)  \$15,000 for Mediation Services of Forsyth County;  
4           (11)  \$23,000 for Mediation Services of Guilford County;  
5           (12)  \$44,000 for the Mountain Dispute Settlement Center;  
6           (13)  \$25,000 for the Orange County Dispute Settlement Center; and  
7           (14)  \$13,000 for the Transylvania Dispute Settlement Center.  
8           Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
