A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT RECOMMENDED BY THE CHILD FATALITY TASK FORCE TO
2 EXTEND THE TASK FORCE UNTIL 1999.

3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 Section 1. Section 285(b) of Chapter 321 of the 1993 Session Laws, as
5 amended by Section 27.8(b) of Chapter 769 of the 1993 Session Laws, Regular Session
6 1994, reads as rewritten:

7 "(b) The Task Force shall provide updated reports to the Governor and General
8 Assembly within the first week of the convening of the 1993 General Assembly, within
9 the first week of the convening of the 1994 Regular Session of the 1993 General
10 Assembly, within the first week of the convening of the 1995 General Assembly, and
11 within the first week of the convening of the 1996 Regular Session of the 1995 General
12 Assembly. ~~The Task Force shall provide a final report to the Governor and General Assembly
13 within the first week of the convening of the 1997 General Assembly. Assembly, and within
14 the first week of the convening of the 1997 General Assembly. The Task Force may
15 provide updated reports to the Governor and General Assembly within one week of the
16 convening of any regular session of the General Assembly meeting in even-numbered
17 years, up to and including 1998. The Task Force shall provide a final report to the~~

1 Governor and General Assembly within the first week of the convening of the 1999
2 General Assembly. The final report shall include final conclusions and recommendations
3 for each of the Task Force's duties, as well as any other recommendations for changes to
4 any law, rule, and policy that it has determined will promote the safety and well-being of
5 children. Any recommendations of changes to law, rule, or policy shall be accompanied
6 by specific legislative or policy proposals and detailed fiscal notes setting forth the costs
7 to the State."

8 Sec. 2. G.S. 143-577(b) reads as rewritten:

9 "(b) The Task Force shall provide updated reports to the Governor and General
10 Assembly within the first week of the convening of the 1993 General Assembly, within
11 the first week of the convening of the 1994 Regular Session of the 1993 General
12 Assembly, within the first week of the convening of the 1995 General Assembly, ~~and~~
13 within the first week of the convening of the 1996 Regular Session of the 1995 General
14 Assembly. ~~The Task Force shall provide a final report to the Governor and General Assembly~~
15 ~~within the first week of the convening of the 1997 General Assembly.~~ Assembly, and within
16 the first week of the convening of the 1997 General Assembly. The Task Force may
17 provide updated reports to the Governor and General Assembly within one week of the
18 convening of any regular session of the General Assembly meeting in even-numbered
19 years, up to and including 1998. The Task Force shall provide a final report to the
20 Governor and General Assembly within the first week of the convening of the 1999
21 General Assembly. The final report shall include final conclusions and recommendations
22 for each of the Task Force's duties, as well as any other recommendations for changes to
23 any law, rule, and policy that it has determined will promote the safety and well-being of
24 children. Any recommendations of changes to law, rule, or policy shall be accompanied
25 by specific legislative or policy proposals and detailed fiscal notes setting forth the costs
26 to the State."

27 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
