AN ACT TO ALLOW CANDIDATES FOR COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL OFFICE IN WAKE COUNTY TO WITHDRAW UP TO THREE DAYS AFTER THE FILING DEADLINE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

18 19 Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding G.S. 163-111(e), a candidate may withdraw a notice of candidacy for board of commissioners, register of deeds, or sheriff after the time at which the right to file for that office expired under G.S. 163-111(e) but before 12:00 noon on the third business day thereafter. In such case, all provisions of law shall apply as if the withdrawal occurred prior to the deadline.

- (b) This section applies only to Wake County.
- Sec. 2. (a) Notwithstanding G.S. 163-294.2(d), a candidate may withdraw a notice of candidacy for municipal office or county board of education after the time at which the right to file for that office expired under G.S. 163-294.2(c) but before 12:00 noon on the third business day thereafter. In such case, the provisions of law shall apply as if the withdrawal occurred prior to the deadline.
- (b) This section applies only to the Wake County Board of Education and to municipalities located wholly within Wake County.
 - Sec. 3. This act applies to elections conducted on or after January 1, 1997.
